Recreation Fee Dollars

Recreation fee dollars are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations benefit as 100% of the funds collected are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value. They support and enhance:

- Maintenance, repair, and facility enhancement related directly to visitor enjoyment, visitor access, and health and safety
- Interpretation, visitor information, visitor service, visitor needs assessments, and signs
- Habitat restoration directly related to wildlife- dependent recreation that is limited to hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, or photography
- Law enforcement related to public use and recreation
- Direct operating or capital costs associated with the recreation fee program

Purchased educational outreach material and signs to update kiosks across the field office.

Special Recreation Permit Monitoring In FY23, the Hassayampa Field Office's planned activities are:

- Continue to help fund the district park ranger and recreation programs.
- Maintain, repair, and enhance facilities to improve visitor experiences, access, and/or address potential health and safety concerns.
- Assist with implementation of the Black Canyon Corridor Travel Management Plan.
- Provide funding for new facilities within the Table Mesa Recreation Area.
- Prepare, monitor and manage Special Recreation Permits.

Connecting with Communities

The Hassayampa Field Office has and will continue to partner with the Black Canyon Trail Coalition and various Special Recreation Permit holders to help with management and maintenance of the Black Canyon National Recreation Trail. These partnerships have been vital in enabling the agency to hear what different user groups are witnessing on the ground and what actions are suggested to address any safety or user conflict concerns.

The field office will also continue our partnership with the Wickenburg Conservation Foundation. Through this partnership, motorized and non-motorized users are working together to improve the overall health and beauty of the Box Canyon area outside of Wickenburg, AZ.

Over the next year, we will be working to improve outreach and education materials, from updating kiosks and information handouts, to public service announcements.
