The Battle Mountain District used FY22 as a year to build its 1232 account to fund larger projects in the coming years. One of the projects include a picnic area Rhyolite. The Battle Mountain District would like to add a large shade structure with several picnic tables for visitors to enjoy. This project will cost approximately \$80,000.00. Another project is the stabilization of structures within the Rhyolite Townsite. The cost of each stabilization project will vary and start around \$20,000.00.

To keep up with the demands at the Rhyolite Ghost Town, due to the volume of visitors it receives, the Battle Mountain District works with a Site Host to manage the daily needs of the site. A living area for the site host was constructed that consists of a shade shelter, concrete pads, and trailer hook-ups for water and power. The water system for the Site Host is in need of replacement. The project will cost upwards of \$100,000.00. 2022 was used to build funds for the project.

Recreation Fee Dollars

They support and enhance:

- Maintenance, repair, and facility enhancement related directly to visitor enjoyment, visitor access, and health and safety
- Interpretation, visitor information, visitor service, visitor needs assessments, and signs
- Habitat restoration directly related to wildlife- dependent recreation that is limited to hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, or photography
- Law enforcement related to public use and recreation
- Direct operating or capital costs associated with the recreation fee program

Recreation fee dollars are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations benefit as 100% of the funds collected are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

The Battle Mountain District Office Recreation Program works closely with various County departments including County Road Departments, Public Lands Departments, and Tourism Departments. The Nye and Esmerelda Counties are heavily involved with the high-speed racing events that the BLM permits. Coordination with them ensures that public health and safety measures are met prior and after each race.

Esmerelda County assists the BLM in maintaining local hot springs. The collaborative actions provide visitors with clean recreation facilities such as restrooms and trash cans overall enhancing the visitors experience.

Nye County assist the BLM with advertising and organization of local outreach events such as National Public Lands Day and Beatty Days. Volunteer days provide the public an opportunity to have a vested interest in their public lands and the opportunity to learn from specialists.
