Campground Maintenance Projects

In FY22, the Tuscarora Field Office completed multiple maintenance projects at Zunino-Jiggs Reservoir, Wild Horse, and Wilson Reservoir recreation areas to preserve the sites and enhance user experience. Projects included the painting of picnic tables, installing bird spikes, and cutting back of trees or overgrown vegetation. Other improvements included replacement of campsite numbers and maintenance of traffic counters.

Connecting with Communities

The Tuscarora Field Office and Elko District Office are proud to partner with the Battle Born Youth Challenge Academy (BBYCA). This program is a "tuition-free, residential, and educational program of the National Guard and the State of Nevada." The Academy "uses a quasi-military structure to reclaim the potential of disproportionately affected youth ages 16-18 across the state." A core component of the program is service to the community, where the cadets are immersed in community service projects. The Elko District Office and the BBYCA have been proud partners since the inaugural class in 2021. The fiscal year 2023 will bring the cadets to the our campground and public lands to complete large maintenance projects and clean-ups.
