This SRMA provides access to popular fishing stretches, which are managed through Special Recreation Permits(SRP). PFO issues 17 Fishing SRPs to local guides and businesses. These permits support the local economy, promote protection of resources, and allow the public to enjoy a highly demanded recreation activity with greater safety, knowledge, and comfort. BLM provided services in the SRMA include access roads, toilets, parking for vehicles & trailers, boat launches, and visitor info.

This is the only fee site within the field office, located on HWY 191 enroute to Teton and Yellowstone National Parks. It boasts a dump station, day use sites with picnic facilities, 17 camping units, drinking water, campground host and adjacent fishing access to blue ribbon trout waters. Recreation fees are vital to the operation of this campground as they cover water testing procedures, vault toilet repairs and pumping, site maintenance, and the reimbursement of full-time campground hosts.

Amount Expended: \$4,000.00

Boat Launch Improvements: With grade repairs and installation of a soil stabilizing mat, a usable launch is now available.

Cleaned and maintained restrooms, picked up trash, repaired and replaced signage at other recreation sites.

Interagency Agreement with USFS keeping trail corridors open, protecting resources, and providing for health and safety.

Partnership with USFS and local county for grooming of X/C trails in the CCC ponds area where USFS and BLM share a boundary.

- Funds will be spent on the administration and monitoring of Special Recreation Permit holders and general land users. This will be accomplished through recreation site visits, law enforcement services, patrols and visitor contact during peak use periods, and the monitoring of recreation resources.
- Maintenance to recreation facilities include repairs to picnic table, vault toilets, kiosks, signage, and weed abatement.
- Campground Host Reimbursement: \$4,500
- SRP Management: \$2,500
- Routine and Annual Maintenance: \$16,500
- Picnic Table Repairs/Replacements: \$2,000
- Kiosk Sign Upgrades: \$2,000
- Law Enforcement: \$1,000
