



# Statewide Wildland-Urban Interface Fuels Treatments Programmatic Environmental Assessment

The Bureau of Land Management has streamlined its process to accelerate fuels treatment projects on 930,000 acres of public lands to reduce wildfire hazards near communities, increase partnership opportunities, and protect natural resources.

## Working Together

Fuels treatment projects will be coordinated across land ownerships to provide the best results for communities, creating a landscape-level network of strategic fuels treatments and breaks within the Wildland-Urban Interface.



## Qualifying Projects

- Must be on BLM-managed public lands
- Included in the statewide environmental assessment
- Identified as high-risk areas
- Falls within a 1-mile WUI buffer zone, or
- Emergency access routes, utility corridors, and critical infrastructure


