General Notes and Comments from the CAWP Team: Coordination and access to this gather was excellent. The BLM, contractor, and onsite veterinarian were willing to ask questions about the comprehensive animal welfare program standards and answer questions asked by the CAWP team. The observed coordination and communication between the BLM, the contractor, and onsite veterinarian were excellent.

The Desatoya HMA has been gathered multiple times over the last several years to implement fertility control treatments and research projects. Many of the mares that were gathered were mares that had been released after being gathered and treated with fertility control previously. This was evident by the "FC" freezemark on their necks. Recapturing wild horses that have been gathered before can be difficult, but the helicopter used pressure and release techniques effectively. The ground crew worked quietly and efficiently to handle and transport the wild horses. Special attention was paid to a mare and young foal during the assessment.

Requirements of Permanent Instruction Memorandum (PIM) 2021-002, Wild Horse and Burro Comprehensive Animal Welfare Program (CAWP):

- All state, district, and field offices will continue to comply with the WHB CAWP policy within their jurisdictions at all times. This includes the CAWP Standards for Wild Horse and Burro Gathers.
- All personnel, including contractor and partners involved in the care, handling, and transportation of wild horses and burros at wild horse and burro gathers are required to complete training annually.

All personnel assisting with the Desatoya wild horse gather were current with CAWP training.
