I am wondering (if permitted through BLM) if it would be plausible to burn and spray at these sites perhaps once a year for the next couple of years to see if that would help deter some of the cattail growth. I would need to do some more research about spraying obviously because we wouldn't want to harm any inhabitants of the ponds, but I think a burn would be a viable option especially for Keg Springs since a lot of those cattails are dead and there appears to be a thin layer of new growth towards the center of the pond.

Also, if we timed when we did spray we may be able to prevent harm to any inhabitants in the event it is early spring/later summer.

I think with all of those sites there's been periodic dredging – by hand at Cluster and w/ equipment at the others to remove some of the vegetation build up. We did do a prescribed burn out at Gandy Marsh which was pretty successful in re-establishing open water habitat. Cattails weren't the main problem there so I don't know if fire would be as effective on cattails and it also would not be a one-time fix. I think Chance was considering some chemical treatment at Pilot Pond, but we didn't try it and I don't recall if that was something he was considering only if the fish were being salvaged first.

I am wondering (if permitted through BLM) if it would be plausible to burn and spray at these sites perhaps once a year for the next couple of years to see if that would help deter some of the cattail growth. I would need to do some more research about spraying obviously because we wouldn't want to

harm any inhabitants of the ponds, but I think a burn would be a viable option especially for Keg Springs since a lot of those cattails are dead and there appears to be a thin layer of new growth towards the center of the pond.

Also, if we timed when we did spray we may be able to prevent harm to any inhabitants in the event it is early spring/later summer.

I think with all of those sites there's been periodic dredging – by hand at Cluster and w/ equipment at the others to remove some of the vegetation build up. That's part of the challenge with these artificial and small sites that don't have any disturbance. We did do a prescribed burn out at Gandy Marsh which was pretty successful in re-establishing open water habitat. Cattails weren't the main problem there so I don't know if fire would be as effective on cattails and it also would not be a one-time fix. I think Chance was considering some chemical treatment at Pilot Pond, but we didn't try it and I don't recall if that was something he was considering only if the fish were being salvaged first.



Thanks Marcus. Things are chaotic as always and seem to be getting more so.

We got an alert about the second spring, the one full of carcasses, from a science group out of one of the Utah universities that have been pulling core samples from it over the last year or two, I'm pretty certain based on my site visit that the cows were trying to take shelter from the wind during one of the big storms this past winter and simply could not get out, or possibly even got snowed over. Simplot pulled about 40 bodies from that spring three or so weeks ago and buried them on some private nearby. We did not get any other reports on that second spring until this, I'll pass that along. We had significant death loss of those operators with winter permits that got caught out on the range this year, some with losses upwards of 30%.



In communication with the DWR legal team, it sounds like we can terminate the contract at any time, with something like five days notice. Given we've already paid her a bit (as is standard) my preference is to hope for the best and if needed, threaten project termination to spur things along.

Based on the other project that Lindsay and I experienced with Lynn, I expect she'll come through with a decent product. But I also expect it will take some pushing.

Please let me know if you have any questions or want to terminate the contract ASAP. I'll include you on prodding-emails to Lynn next week if needed. Thanks - and sorry this project is so far behind schedule.

Hi everyone,

I read the section in the LandCART User's Guide on Sen's slope test and thought I might could help refine our conversation a little. First, the guide does say it uses the median in one sentence (page 12 first paragraph) and mean in another (page 12 second paragraph). But I'm pretty sure it means that it's reporting the median Sen's value based on the mean indicator values for the AOI.

Second, it seems that the length of the time series (i.e., number of years) is the issue regarding interpreting p-values, not the size of the inference area. LandCART is just taking the mean for the AOI, no matter the size of the AOI, so the spatial area shouldn't matter. But Sen's test is essentially creating a distribution of all the observed differences between every pair of years. For example, one data point will be the slope between 2006 and 2007 (i.e., (x2007 - x2006)/1), and another will be the slope between 2008 and 2020 (i.e., (x2020 - x2008)/12). We then use the median (50th percentile) of that distribution as our "best" estimate of slope and calculate p-values based on the percentiles observed in the data. For example, if we have 105 possible year combinations (as you do from 2006-2021) and 5 pairs have a slope <0, the p-value will be 0.048 (i.e., 5/105). So when you have a short time series, you won't have enough data points to create a good distribution. With only 5 years, you end up with 10 pairs of years - if only 1 pair has a negative slope, your p-value would be 0.1, but if 2 have a negative slope, your p-value jumps to 0.2. Essentially with short time series, your data is too discretized to effectively represent a p-value. In your case, you have 105 year pairs, so if you go from 5 pairs with negative slopes to 6 pairs, your p-value only goes from 0.048 to 0.057. It's less sensitive to the influence of one year pair when the time series is longer.

I hope that helps. Let me know if you have any more questions.



The land health standards are descriptions of the desired condition of the biological and physical components and characteristics of rangelands. Each land health standard has associated indicators which are features of an ecosystem that can be measured or observed in order to gain an understanding of the relative condition of a particular landscape or portion of a landscape (BLM, 1997). Indicators are evaluated using methods and techniques that are considered best available science and with defensible methodology. Not every indicator applies equally to every acre of land or ecological site, Similarly, because of natural variability, extreme degradation, or management objectives, there may be a need for discretion in applying the standards of rangeland health when evaluating standards (BLM, 1997). Various monitoring datasets were used to assess achievement of land health standards in the WBE allotments (Table 1).

An interdisciplinary team (IDT) including BLM specialists in range management, hydrology, wildlife biology, aquatic ecology, and soil science reviewed information within the assessment area. A brief description of the quantitative and qualitative methods and analysis used in the assessment are described below. Explicit details on how to collect and interpret the data can be found in cited technical references documents. Data were collected by the IDT, contracted field crews, Utah Division of Wildlife Resources (UDWR), Utah State University (USU), United States Department of Agriculture-Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDANRCS) crews, and the United States Geological Survey (USGS).

Land Health Standard 1

Proposed assessment methods

The IDT followed the methods outlined in BLM TN 453 "Guide to Using AIM and LMF Data in Land Health Evaluations and Authorizations of Permitted Uses" (Kachergis et al. 2020), TN 455 "Applying and Interpreting Assessment, Inventory, and Monitoring (AIM) Data at the Field Office Level: An Example" (Grant-Hoffman et al. 2021), and BLM Handbook H-4180-1, "Rangeland Health Standards" (BLM 2001) to assess land health standards one through four.

Multiple lines of evidence were used to assess LHS #1 including: assessing AIM, LMF, and

other quantitative data (upland trend, fuels and ESR monitoring data, ESI soil stability) using the benchmark method, qualitative assessments (PFC, IIRH), photo plots, analysis of nested frequency and key species, remote sensing (RAP Tool, LandCART), land use history, precipitation and NDVI, IDT site visits, and professional opinion. Supplemental data including utilization studies, analysis of actual use to permitted use and available AUMs, drought analysis by year of data collection, comparison of annual production (lbs/ac) by year, fence and water development mapping and condition, and existing structural range improvements were used in addition to interpret the results of the assessment.

First, the IDT reviewed available datasets and selected relevant indicators for each land health standard (Table 1). Datasets were reviewed to determine which methods and indicators were comparable (Table 6). Next, the IDT reviewed available ecological site descriptions (ESDs) for Box Elder County to determine appropriate benchmarks for each selected indicator for LHS #1 and 3. Due to the number of incomplete and/or provisional ESDs for the assessment area, the IDT decided to use existing monitoring data to inform benchmark values as outlined in TN 453, and Appendix 2 of TN 455. These data were then aggregated and analyzed using upper and lower limits of benchmarks using quantiles from all AIM points within MLRA 28[JED1] [JED1] and other scientific data as determined by the SLFO IDT (see TN 455, Appendix A for detailed methods).

After reviewing the initial analysis from the TN-455.A method, the IDT decided to also analyze each of the nine selected indicators for LHS #1 using set values (reference condition of ecological site descriptions) as outlined in the benchmark method in TN 453. Benchmarks for each indicator were determined by the ecological site reference condition value. Indicators meeting a benchmark were equal to or greater than the low reference condition value. A total of 29 ecological sites and XX plots were evaluated using this method.

The IDT decided to present the analyses from both the TN-455.A (quantile) and benchmark (TN 453) approach side by side. This was done as an additional line of evidence. Benchmarks and the percent quartile threshold for each ecological site are shown in Table #.

The IDT evaluated whether each plot was meeting the quantitative objectives by comparing indicator values at each plot to applicable benchmark values (Table #). The IDT considered each plot's location and land use history when summarizing the benchmark analysis results. For instance, the AIM and LMF points were identified using a random stratified sample design, whereas, upland trend plots represent "key areas", and fuels monitoring plots were purposefully selected to represent the effectiveness of management. After the IDT summarized the results of the benchmark (TN 453) and percentile methods (TN 455) by allotment, they assessed additional lines of evidence prior to making determining whether individual allotments were meeting LHS #1.

Additional lines of evidence:

Ecological Site Inventory

The BLM completed Ecological Site Inventories (ESI) (Habich 2001) at 71 sites in the assessment area in 2006 (Figure 1). Based on those inventories, a total of 28 ecological sites occur on the BLM-managed lands in the assessment area (Appendix A). The most common ecological sites are upland stony clay, upland loam, upland shallow loam, upland stony loam and mountain gravelly loam.

Through the ESI process, a comparison of vegetation production and composition can be made between the existing community and the Historical Climax Plant Community (HCPC) described in the ESD. This comparison involves sampling the productivity by species (e.g., clipping and weighing), or estimating the productivity based on previous samples, in order to generate a similarity index. The existing productivity is then summed for all measured species and described as a percentage of the total productivity in the HCPC, thereby generating the similarity index. Similarity indexes corresponding to successional status (Table 4). Table 5 describes the successional status for each allotment in the assessment area.

The ESI found that Red Butte and Lynn are mostly in the mid seral successional status. Owl Springs and Dry Canyon are mostly in the mid seral and late seral successional status. Kimball Creek are mostly in the late seral successional status. Data from the ESI were used by the NRCS to update ecological site descriptions within Box Elder County. ESI data is typically used in assessing Utah Standards for Rangeland Health #1 and #3. However, these data were collected in 2006 and are provided here as baseline conditions for the allotments in 2006. It is not assumed that allotments have remained in the same successional status since the 2006 ESI assessment.

Interpreting Indicators of Rangeland Health

A BLM interdisciplinary team completed the Interpreting Indicators of Rangeland Health protocol (IIRH; Pellant et al. 2005) on the Dry Canyon, Kimball Creek, Lynn, Owl Springs, and Red Butte allotments in 2006 (Figure X). Figure X shows the location of the sites assessed (n=71). No determination of rangeland health was made at the time of the data collection (2006), as the BLM recognized that more quantitative data was needed to make a determination. IIRH data is typically used in assessing Utah Standards for Rangeland Health #1 and #3. However, these data were collected in 2006 and are provided here as baseline conditions for the allotments in 2006. It is not assumed that the allotments have remained in the same condition since the 2006 IIRH assessment.

Greetings Marcus! I hope all is well with you.

Late yesterday I went up to Patterson Pass in the north end of the Pilot Range, as I approached the state line I passed an older Ford F250ish, green and white in my memory, driving down the hill with a large wire water tank in the bed. When I got to the state line and the cattleguard I noticed a lot of piping and a white bucket on the ground on the Utah side of the cattleguard. I continued on up to the top of the pass, on the way back down I noted the white bucket was gone but the piping was still coiled up on the ground, along with what looks like a car battery and a pump and maybe a few other items that are back in the brush and just visible in the photo. Appears that one or more of the off the grid residents in Pilot Valley is pumping water out of the little stream right on the Utah side of the line, which is public/BLM according to a shapefile I found.

Thought I'd pass this along, I'm also including the Elko law enforcement staff in this message. Whoever is doing the pumping had the gate next to the cattleguard open and by the tire tracks are backing through it to fill their tanks. I shut the gate before I left and then let both of the livestock permittees on the Nevada side know they may need to watch that area until such time as we get enough snow to discourage cattle from wandering that far up the hill.

I spoke with Drake Walker about the cows in the Grouse Creek allotment that I saw today. There were four mother cows and four calves with them. He said he's out of town but will get back and check them as quickly as he is he can he said that there was a hole in the fence by the trough, and it looked big enough for a calf, but not big enough for a cow to get through when he moved the other group out of the grouse Creek allotment. I also spoke with Shorty Williams with River View Ranch and told him that there were some cows in the Grouse Creek allotment that were his with Drake's cows. He told me that they would go and check. I sent him a map with where I saw the cows. he also said that the plan is for the Permittee's to move their cows out of buckskin around the first part of next week. I asked him if the permit gives that kind of flexibility and he didn't know. He just said that that as always how it has been done with the Permittee's on the allotment. he also said that they plan to move cows out of red Butte next week down to owl Springs. I asked him if that permit had the flexibility to move cows after the date and he wasn't sure.
