Tread Lightly and BLM Work on Learners Loops

Amount Expended: \$140,132.36

Sand Mountain Recreation Area continues to be the busiest recreation site in the Carson City District with over 100,000 visitors a year, with human health and safety being the number one priority for the BLM. This work continues through community partnerships with Tread Lightly, Renown Children's Hospital, Nevada Outdoor School, and Nevada Off Road Association. Work accomplished included a free helmet education program for youth and work on the youth learners loops and increased LE presence.

Free Helmet Program

Amount Expended: \$20,100.36

In response to three youth fatalities in the last three years, SMRA has rolled out an education program centered around youth safety and helmets. The result has been thousands of contacts, increased signage, learner's loops work, and awarding over 180 free helmets to children. Additional work was accomplished to establish and harden the recreation boundary to limit camping during busy weekends such as Halloween.

Planned Activities

NPLD at SMRA 2023

In FY24, plans are to continue developing infrastructure at Sand Mountain Recreation Area including paving, power and campground host site. It is predicted that SRP's for vending will continue to increase as well as SRP's for motorized and non-motorized events continue to rise as well. Research of a trail system for non-motorized as well as motorized has begun from Fallon, NV with connection to SMRA.

Walker Lake will transition to recreation.gov for fee collection in response to visitor input. Increased fee compliance will afford: boat ramp repair work, shade structure repair work, and a campground host site.

SRP UTV and dirt bike PPE will be required for monitoring events.
