

Remote Kiosks Benefit Visitors

Amount Expended: \$29,200.00

In fiscal year 2024, Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument installed four electronic remote off-grid kiosks at the Dripping Springs Natural Area and Aguirre Springs Recreation Area. The installation of these kiosks provided an immediate benefit to visitors of both areas and to the monument fee collection programs. Allowing visitors to pay with a credit card for day passes and camp sites is more convenient and efficient for the recreation fee program.

Visitor Safety and Access Update

Amount Expended: \$51,100.00

With the support of Friends of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks and Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act (FLREA) funding, the monument is working to improve visitor safety and access at the Dripping Springs Natural Area. Projects that were tackled in fiscal year 2024 included relocating the recreation fee pay box, improving Americans with Disabilities Act access to the La Cueva trailhead and visitor center, constructing a safer Las Cruces overlook area, and improving railings on the access paths to the restroom facilities.
