Historic Cabin Renovation

Amount Expended: \$10,000.00

In addition to patrolling the Rogue Wild and Scenic River and assisting recreationists, BLM River Rangers also support other natural resource programs. In FY 24, the river staff assisted with the renovation of the Historic Zane Grey Cabin on the river, and floated personnel to the site and assisted with felling trees and peeling logs for the restoration of the cabin. This type of project not only enhances the visitor experience, it also strengthens internal and external partnerships, and protects cultural resources.

Amount Expended: \$10,000.00

Hog Creek Boat Launch is one of the most heavily visited access points on the Rogue Wild & Scenic River, popular with recreational boaters as well as commercial guides. In FY 24, BLM was able to repair several sections of the asphalt parking lot. Sections of broken asphalt were removed with heavy equipment and replaced with new road base and asphalt. This parking lot upgrade improves vehicular access and will enhance the visitor experience for years to come.

Other Accomplishments

- Trail maintenance on the Rogue River Trail. Facility and site maintenance at river access sites. Staffed the Rogue River Ranch with volunteer hosts/caretakers.
- River Rangers patrolled the river, monitoring permits, cleaning up river sites, and assisting with medical emergencies and boat recovery.
- Issued and administered 44 Commercial SRP's on the Rogue. Processed 1,100 non-commercial ISRP's out of the Rand Visitor Center. In total, 7,217 visitors were able to access the river with permits issued out of Rand.

Smullin Visitor Center at Rand

- Fully staff the Smullin Visitor Center at Rand, providing visitors with information and issuing permits.
- Routine annual maintenance of all river access sites, including parking lot maintenance.
- Enter into assistance agreements with Siskiyou Mountain Club and NW Youth Corps to maintain the Rogue River and Rainie Falls trails.
- Patrol the river corridor, monitor permits for compliance, and assist boaters on the river.
- Recruit volunteer hosts/caretakers to staff the Rogue River Ranch.
