**Amount Expended: \$3,080**

Public restrooms play a key role in supporting recreational interests at Knolls Special Recreation Management Area. Due their remote locations, these public restrooms are difficult and expensive to maintain. The Salt Lake Field Office works diligently to provide a safe and hygienic environment for all users. Public restrooms are also maintained at Fivemile Pass Recreation Area, Clover Springs Campground, Little Creek Campground, and Simpson Springs Campground.

**Amount Expended: \$4,348**

Due to the size, complexity, and risk associated with the annual Speed Week event at Bonneville Salt Flats Special Recreation Management Area, the Salt Lake Field Office provides constant event monitoring. Law Enforcement Rangers are called in to augment our staff, creating additional expenses. Event oversight is critical to the safety of the event as well as protection of the Bonneville Salt Flats.

## Other Accomplishments

- Two new Interpretation kiosks placed at the Silver Island Mountains along the perimeter road.
- Fourth Outdoor Recreation Planner hired through Inflation Reduction Act funds, improving our office's capacity to manage a growing demand for public land use in the Upper Bear River priority watershed.
- Wages covered for our Law Enforcement Officers, who patrol high use recreation areas during peak usage times.

Install shade structures and improve parking at Fivemile Pass: \$150,000

Design and install kiosks at Bonneville Salt Flats: \$40,000

Developments and site design on West Mountain: \$200,000

Provide supplementary bathroom cleanings during high use seasons: \$4,880

Start Environmental Assessment for Bonneville Salt Flats, planning and solidifying supplementary rules for use: \$40,000

Purchase picnic tables, fire rings, and signage for Clover Campground: \$80,000
