Amount Expended: \$4,918.51

Richard Green, returned to the Tuscarora Field Office, for his 10th year of service, to assist with the Zunino-Jiggs, Wild horse, and Wilson recreation areas. Green cleans and stocks restrooms, maintains campsites, picnic tables, fire rings, and vegetation, patrols campgrounds, and answers visitor questions. Richard received the 2024 BLM's Outstanding Volunteer Achievement Award for his contributions to the Tuscarora recreation sites. Richard receives a small reimbursement paid through the BLM's Recreation Use Permit Fees.

Amount Expended: \$1,048.00

In FY24, the Tuscarora Field Office completed maintenance projects at all 3 recreation sites: Zunino-Jiggs Reservoir, Wildhorse, and Wilson Reservoir. Enhancing and providing better user experiences. Projects included restroom interior painting and repairs, picnic table repairs, and maintenance to campsites. Other improvements included new bird spikes to restrooms and vegetation management.
