FIRE CLOSURE

Pursuant to 43 CFR 8351.2-1 or 43 CFR 9212.2 (a) and beginning at 12:01 a.m., May 1, 2025, and continuing until October 31, 2025, the following are prohibited on Bureau of Land Management public lands in the La Pine basin described below:

Prohibited Acts:

- 1. Building, igniting, maintaining, using, and/or actively attending within 20', a campfire, charcoal fire, or any other type of open flame. *EXCEPTION:* Using commercially manufactured metal camp stoves for cooking, portable propane campfires, and shielded lanterns, when fueled with bottled propane or liquid fuel and operated in a responsible manner. Cooking stoves, portable propane campfires or lanterns must meet UL/CSA safety standards.
- 2. Smoking, except while in non-public buildings, closed vehicles, in boats on lakes or rivers, or while standing in an area at least three feet in diameter that is cleared of vegetation or flammable material.

Descriptions of Public Lands included in this closure:

All BLM-administered lands within the following boundary: South Century Drive on the north, the Fremont-Winema National Forest boundary on the south, and the Deschutes National Forest on the east and west. Except in emergency conditions or with advanced permission from an agency authorized officer, there are no exceptions to this closure.

Anyone who is found guilty of violating a fire prevention order may be subject to prosecution under any applicable law or BLM regulation. A violation of this order may be classified as a Class A Misdemeanor Offense under 43 USC 1733(a) FLPMA, 18 USC 3559, and 18 USC 3571 Sentence of Fine - Sentencing Reform Act, Oct. 12, 1984. If the violation does not result in death, anyone who violates this order may be fined not more than \$100,000 and/or imprisoned for not more than 12 months or may be fined in accordance with the applicable provisions of 18 USC 3571. Restitution for total fire suppression and damage costs incurred will be borne by the responsible party.
