### TIMBER SALE NOTICE

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Bureau of Land Management will offer for sale timber as described herein for oral auction, pursuant to Instructions to Bidders, as stated on Form No. 5440-9, attached. Written and oral bids will be received by the District Manager, or their representative, at the **SPRINGFIELD INTERAGENCY OFFICE**, **NORTHWEST OREGON DISTRICT OFFICE**, **3106 PIERCE PARKWAY**, **SPRINGFIELD**, **OREGON**. The timber sale will commence at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, **July 24**, **2025**.

**THIS TIMBER SALE NOTICE** does <u>not</u> constitute the decision document for purposes of appeal of a forest management decision. Consistent with 43 CFR Subpart 5003.2(b), the date the BLM posts the forest management decision on the BLM's ePlanning website establishes the effective date of the decision for purposes of an administrative appeal.

**A WRITTEN BID** on Form 5440-9 at not less than the appraised price on a unit basis per species and the required minimum bid deposit shall be required to participate in oral bidding for each tract.

FOR SBA SET-ASIDE TRACTS, the bidder must not have been determined by the Small Business Administration to be ineligible for preferential award for set-aside sales and must accompany the bid deposit with a self-certification statement that the bidder is qualified as a small business concern as defined by the Small Business Administration in its regulations, Title 13, Chapter I, Part 121 (Revision 7) as amended, of the Code of Federal Regulations. The Form 5430-1 Self Certification Statement is attached hereto. The successful bidder will be required to sign SBA Form 723 "Small Business Certification Required on All Preferential Sales of Set-Aside Timber" at the time the timber sale contract is signed. Section 2(a) of Form 723 requires that successful bidders on SBA set-aside tracts must comply with delivery requirements pertaining to timber volume. No more than 30 percent of the timber volume from a set-aside sale may be delivered for manufacturing to a business that is not a small business, as defined by the SBA (13 CFR 121.507 (a)). A copy of SBA form 723 is attached.

THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER, as a condition of award, will be required to complete and/or sign the following forms:

- 1. Form 5430-11, a certification that the bid was arrived at by the bidder or offerer independently, and was tendered without collusion with any other bidder or offerer.
- 2. Form 5450-17, Export Determination.

**PRE-AWARD QUALIFICATIONS**. The high bidder may be required to furnish information to determine the ability to perform the obligations of the contract. If the high bidder is determined not qualified, not responsible or refuses to respond within 15 days of a request for information pertaining to qualifications, the contract may be offered and awarded for the amount of the high bid to the highest of the bidders who is qualified, responsible, and willing to accept the contract.

**A PERFORMANCE BOND** in an amount not less than 20 percent of the total purchase price will be required for all contracts of \$2,500.00 or more, but the amount of the bond shall not be in excess of \$500,000.00, except when the Purchaser opts to increase the minimum bond as provided in 43 CFR 5451.2. A minimum performance bond of not less than \$500.00 will be required for all installment contracts less than \$2,500.00.

**INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS** may be authorized for sales of \$500.00 or more. Required installments will be determined by BLM. For sales under \$500,000.00, installments will not be less than 10% of the total purchase price. For sales of \$500,000.00 or more, installment payments shall be \$50,000.00.

**LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION**. All timber sales, including timber from Federal rights-of-ways, shall be subject to the restrictions relating to the export and substitution of unprocessed timber from the United States in accordance with P.L. 94-165 and 43 CFR 5400 and 5424, as amended.

**LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION RESTRICTIONS**. Excepting Port-Orford-cedar, all timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

**SPECIAL PROVISIONS.** A revised Special Provision has been added to the contract which enables the Contracting Officer to suspend the contract to facilitate protection of certain plant or animal species, and/or to modify or terminate the contract when necessary to: (1) Comply with the Endangered Species Act or to prevent incidental take of northern spotted owls in accordance with management direction in the Record of Decision (ROD) and Resource Management Plan (RMP), or; (2) Comply with a stay or remedy issued by the Interior Board of Land Appeals or a court order, or; (3) Protect species which were identified for protection in accordance with management direction established in the ROD and RMP.

**ADDITIONAL INFORMATION** concerning each timber sale tract described herein is available at the above District Office. A copy of the timber sale contract is also available for inspection at the District Office. This prospectus includes maps and tables that cannot be made Section 508 compliant. For help with its data or information, please contact the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office at (541) 683-6776.

**THE VOLUMES LISTED** herein are estimates only, based on 16-foot taper breaks, which must be taken into consideration if comparisons are made with volume predictions based on other standards. The volumes based on 32-foot taper breaks are shown for comparison purposes. No sale shall be made for less than the total purchase price, without regard to the amount bid per unit, even though quantity of timber actually cut or removed or designated for taking is more or less than the estimated volume or quantity so listed.

**ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS** were prepared for the Ghost Town sale, and a Finding of No Significant Impact have been documented. These documents are available for inspection as background for these sales at the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office.

**AN ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS (EA)** was prepared for the N126 LSR Landscape Project, which includes the Upper Greenleaf sale. A Finding of No Significant Impact and Decision Record for the EA have been documented. A Determination of NEPA Adequacy (DNA) has been documented for Upper Greenleaf. These documents are available for inspection as background for this sale at the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office.

<u>APPRAISED PRICES</u> are calculated by determining market value through the analytical appraisal method. The minimum bid increment will be \$0.10 per MBF or multiples thereof.

<u>LOG EXPORT RESTRICTIONS</u>: All timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

<u>NOTE</u>: The volume for this timber sale has been calculated using 16 foot eastside Scribner rules, and the 32 foot log volumes are estimates derived from the 16 foot volumes.

<u>CRUISE INFORMATION</u>: The timber volumes for Douglas-fir, Western hemlock, and Grandfir in the Regeneration Harvest Areas were based on a variable plot cruise for estimating board foot volume. Plots were measured using a 40 basal area factor for a total of 174 plots. The timber volumes for Douglas-fir and Western hemlock in the Partial Harvest Areas were also based on a variable plot cruise for estimating board foot volume. Plots were measured using a 20 basal area factor for a total of 76 plots. Bigleaf maple in all Regeneration Harvest Areas were based on a 100% cruise for estimating board foot volume. The timber volumes for Douglas-fir in the rights-of-way were based on a 3P cruise for estimating board foot volume. Western hemlock in the rights-of-way were based on a 100% cruise for estimating board foot volume. With respect to merchantable Douglas-fir; the average tree is 16.5" DBHOB; the average log contains 75 bd. ft.; the total gross merchantable volume is approximately 6,110 MBF; and 95% recovery is expected.

<u>CUTTING AREA:</u> Approximately 130 acres shall be regeneration harvested, 57 acres partially harvested, and approximately 4 acres of right-of-way shall be cleared.

- 5. Lands covered by Right-of-Way and Road Use Agreement E-573 between Weyerhaeuser Timber Holdings Inc. and the United States. In the use of tailholds and guybacks, the Purchaser shall enter into a license agreement with Weyerhaeuser Timber Holdings Inc. The license agreement shall be delivered to Weyerhaeuser Timber Holdings Inc. for execution at least 15 days prior to any use of company roads. <u>ROAD MAINTENANCE:</u> The Purchaser shall pay to the BLM a rockwear fee of \$3,342.29. The Purchaser shall pay a rockwear fee of \$2,095.68 to Franklin-Clarkson Timber Company. See Exhibit D map for specifications of road maintenance responsibility. Only the map page of the Exhibit D is included in the Prospectus. Refer to the contract file for the full Exhibit D.

In addition to the quantities shown below, 400 cubic yards (truck measure) of maintenance rock (175 cubic yards of 3" minus, 175 cubic yards of 1.5" minus and 50 cubic yards of 34" minus) is required. Additional road reinforcement (rocking) may be required for wet weather haul and will be at the Purchaser's expense.

## **ROAD DECOMMISSIONING:**

Spurs 4A, 5A, 5B, 9A, 9B, 9C

Road Nos. 15-1-4.2, 15-1-5.4, 15-1-5.5 and 15-1-5.6 Estimated Cost of Decommissioning: \$8,265.96

Special Requirements: Operations limited to periods of dry weather.

<u>DURATION OF CONTRACT</u>: Duration of the contract will be 36 months for cutting and removal of timber.

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road construction, road renovation, road improvement, road maintenance, road decommissioning, logging methods, prevention of erosion, logging residue reduction, snag creation, and submission of a written logging plan specifying landing locations and logging schedule.

Under Sec. 26 of the timber sale contract, ground-based logging and mechanical felling will be prohibited during periods of excessive soil moisture. This will normally limit ground-based logging and mechanized felling from June 1 to October 15.

## OTHER SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. The Purchaser shall be required to clean logging, road, decommissioning, and slash piling equipment prior to entry on BLM lands.
- 2. The Purchaser shall provide a map of requested skyline road and skid trail locations a minimum of seven (7) working days in advance of cutting to obtain approval of the locations from the Authorized Officer.
- 3. Haul on all natural surface roads shall be limited to the dry season (typically June 1-Oct. 31).

4. The Purchaser shall be required to cut and process non-merchantable trees in the Regeneration Harvest Areas.

- 5. The Purchaser shall be required to cut and leave all white painted trees in Right-of Way (Clearing) of Spur 9A and Spur 9B.
- 6. No felling, yarding, or loading is permitted in or through the Reserve Area shown on Exhibit A, except in the Special Tailhold and Guyback Areas shown on Exhibit A. Specific restrictions apply to these areas. See Special Provisions.
- 7. Logging, road construction, and road maintenance equipment, including passenger vehicles, as well as logging debris including logs, limbs and tops, shall not be permitted in the Equipment and Operations Exclusion Area, shown on Exhibit A. Trees shall be directionally felled away from these areas.
- 8. Long reaches, intermediate supports, and lift trees will be needed during cable operations.
- 9. Upon completion of yarding, the Purchaser shall create one hundred ninety (190) snags by topping and girdling.
- 10. The Purchaser shall perform logging residue reduction and site preparation work, to include machine piling, piling at landings and along roadsides, covering, lop and scatter, and pile burning on up to 72 acres.
- 11. Black 6 Mil plastic shall be required for all pile covering.
- 12. In the Regeneration Harvest Areas whole tree yarding or yarding with tops attached will be required.
- 13. In all Partial Harvest Areas, felled trees shall be bucked into log lengths not to exceed forty-one (41) feet before yarding. No harvest activites shall be conducted in the Partial Harvest Areas during sap flow from April 1 to June 15 of each year, unless otherwise approved by the Authorized Officer.
- 14. The Purchaser shall be required to spread BLM-provided seed and mulch at culverts and designated areas.
- 15. The Purchaser shall provide warning signs and flaggers in accordance with Section 29 of this contract to control traffic in the contract area during active operations. Roads shall not be blocked by such operations for more than 20 minutes.
- 16. Prior to the start of all road construction, renovation or improvement operations, the Purchaser shall meet with BPA representatives and the Authorized Officer.
- 17. Prior to contruction, renovation, improvement and maintenance, Purchaser shall locate all underground utilities.
- 18. Purchaser shall submit an application to Linn County for a right-of-way encroachment for Spurs 9A, 9B and 9C.
- 19. Quarry operations must be completed by September 30, 2026.

<u>OPTIONAL CONTRIBUTION</u>: The Purchaser will have the option of performing pile burning and mop-up, or contributing \$11,384.80 in lieu thereof. The option must be declared prior to contract execution. Piling and covering are not included in the Optional Contribution and will remain the responsibility of the Purchaser.

- 4. Roads covered by a Right-of-Way and Road Use Agreement E-308 between Roseburg Resources Company and the United States. In the construction, renovation, and use of private roads, the Purchaser shall enter into a license agreement with Roseburg Resource Co. The license agreement shall be delivered to Roseburg Resource Co. for execution at least 15 days prior to any use of company roads. See the Prospectus for full terms and conditions of use.
- 5. Roads covered by a Right-of-Way and Road Use Agreement E-1059 between Matthew and Heather Wiskow and the United States. In the renovation and use of private roads, the Purchaser shall enter into a license agreement with Wiskow. The license agreement shall be delivered to Wiskow for execution at least 15 days prior to any use of private roads. See the Prospectus for full terms and conditions of use.

<u>ROAD MAINTENANCE:</u> The Purchaser shall pay road use fees of \$4,386.00 to Roseburg Resource Co. The Purchaser shall pay BLM a road maintenance fee of \$373.43 and a rockwear fee of \$4,625.99.

In addition to the quantities shown below, 500 cubic yards (truck measure) of maintenance rock and surface protection rock is required. Upon the completion of harvest, an additional 425 total cubic yards (truck measure) of 1½" minus is required on Road Nos. 18-6-35.2 (350 CY) and 19-6-11.7 (75 CY). Additional road reinforcement (rocking) may be required for wet weather haul and will be at the Purchaser's expense. Load tickets are required for maintenance rock accounting. See Exhibit D map for specification of road maintenance responsibility. Only the map pages of Exhibit D is included in the Prospectus. Refer to the contract file for the full Exhibit D.

**DURATION OF CONTRACT**: Duration of the contract will be 36 months for cutting and removal of timber.

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road construction, road renovation, road maintenance, logging methods, prevention of erosion, falling of snags, creation of snags, creation of course woody debris, falling of all trees designated for cutting, logging residue reduction, and submission of a written logging plan specifying spur road locations, landing locations, logging methods, and logging schedule.

Under Sec. 26 of the timber sale contract, ground based logging will be prohibited during periods of high soil moisture. This will normally limit ground based logging to July, August and September.

It is estimated that approximately 949 MBF of additional timber, such as corridor and guyline trees, may be removed under the contract, but it is not included in the advertised sale volume, nor is it included in the timber sale appraisal.

## OTHER SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Upon completion of yarding create 221 snags, approximately 1 per acre. The Purchaser shall be responsible for marking, tallying and submitting snag creation totals.
- No yarding or hauling shall be conducted on natural surfaced roads during periods of wet weather as determined by the Authorized Officer.
- Yarding shall be done with a carriage equipped skyline capable of yarding 1,200 feet slope distance in the Harvest Areas on slopes greater than 35%.
- Yarding across streams requires full suspension above the stream.

- Limbs and tops shall remain attached to the tree and be yarded to the landing.
- With the exception of hauling, daily operations within the Special Operating Area shall not be permitted from April 1 through August 5 of each year, both days inclusive; and shall not begin until 2 hours after sunrise and shall cease 2 hours prior to sunset from August 6 through September 15 of each year, both days inclusive.
- In the Special Holding Areas, obtain approval from the Authorized Officer prior to attaching logging equipment to any tree.
- One Hundred thirteen (113) trees marked with yellow paint shall not be felled or damaged during logging operations.
- The Purchaser shall have the option to construct and surface Spur G as shown on Exhibit C. If the Purchaser exercises their option, all costs associated with construction, surfacing and/or maintenance, shall be at the Purchaser's expense.
- The Purchaser shall have the option of surfacing Spurs J and Road Nos. 19-6-14 Seg. B & -14.1 at the Purchaser's expense.
- A yarding wedge with corridors across Roseburg Resources Company will be required and the Purchaser shall abide by all terms and conditions outlined in the license agreement.
- Trees within striking distance of the Powerline Right-of-Way shall be directionally felled away from the power lines, as directed by the Authorized Officer. Prior to beginning operations adjacent to the Power Line Right-of-Way, the Purchaser shall contact Lane Electric Cooperative (541-484-1151).
- Underground utilities are present along Panther Creek Road (County Road No. 4086) and Road Nos. 18-6-35, 18-6-35.2 and 19-6-11.7. Prior to operations in the area, the Purchaser shall contact the Oregon Utility Notification Center and request a line locate. Resolution of any damage to utilities shall be between the Purchaser and said utility owner.
- Loading and logging operations adjacent to Road Nos. 18-6-35, 18-6-35.2 and 19-6-11.7 shall be conducted off of the rocked surface where possible. Purchaser selected landing locations shall be approved by the Authorized Officer prior to construction.
- The Purchaser shall comply with the terms and conditions of Facility Permits from Lane County Department of Public Works including but not limited to:
  - Flaggers required when equipment is in the roadway, one lane is to remain open to traffic at all times.
  - Warning signs and flaggers are required when operating within two tree lengths of county roads.
  - o Surfacing on Panther Creek Road (County Road No. 4086) shall be protected during operations.
  - o No loading or unloading of tracked equipment shall be allowed on the paved surface of Panther Creek Road.
  - Tracked equipment may operate on the paved roadway of Panther Creek provided; however, the tracks are not allowed to touch the road surface and the responsible party is required to provide a mechanism to prevent direct contact with the road surface.
- Clean equipment prior to arrival on BLM-managed lands.
- Upon completion of hauling, all decommissioning shall be completed during the dry season and as directed by the Authorized Officer. Decommissioning measures may include:
  - Decompact and/or block skid trails and natural surfaced roads with decompaction equipment, such as a track mounted excavator with a thumb.
  - o Construct drainage dips, waterbars, and/or lead-off ditches.
  - Block at entry points using earthen barricades as directed by the Authorized Officer.
- Sec. 44(e) contains explicit instruction on requirements for equipment and personnel involved in pile burning.
- Within 25 feet of Spurs A-E, H-K, and Road Nos. 18-6-35, -35.1, -35.2, 19-6-11.3, -11.4, -11.5, -11.6, -11.7, and 19-6-14.1 slash shall be piled, covered and burned within the Harvest Areas.
- In-unit machine piling, covering, and burning of 61 acres is required and is shown on Exhibit F.


<u>BUYOUT SECURITY DEPOSIT</u>: The Purchaser will have the option of performing pile burning or making a buyout security deposit of \$8,688.40 in lieu thereof. The option must be declared prior to contract execution. Piling and covering are not included in the Optional Contribution and will remain the responsibility of the Purchaser.

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF HOW TO GET TO THE TIMBER SALE AREA: Access to the sale is through a locked gate over private roads. Prospective bidders may obtain a key from the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office and proceed to the sale area. <u>To Access Harvest Area 1</u>: From Crow, travel southeast on Territorial Road for approx. 1.25 miles, then turn southwest on Wolf Creek County Road. Travel for 3.75 miles, then turn west onto Creat Road (Road No. 18-6-35) and follow the signs to the Timber Sale Area.

<u>To Access Harvest Area 2</u>: From Harvest Area 1 travel southwest approximately 2 miles on Wolf Creek County Road and turn southeast onto Panther Creek County Road. To access the Timber Sale Area to the south of Panther Creek County Road, travel .5 of a mile and proceed through the gate to the south onto road number 19-6-10. Follow the signs to the Timber Sale Area.






