CRUISE INFORMATION: Volumes were based upon units 1-6 and 10-17 being cruised using variable plot (PCMTRE) with a 20 BAF and units 7-9, all merchantable trees were 100% cruised. All trees were cruised in 16-foot log lengths. With respect to merchantable trees of all conifer species; the average tree is 18.7" DBOH; the average gross merchantable log contains 97 bd. Ft.; the gross volume is approximately 12,378 tons; and 78% recovery is expected. Average ponderosa pine (PP) quadratic mean diameter is 18.1" DBHOB; average gross merchantable log for PP is 88 bd. ft., and 74% recovery is expected for PP. A 16.61% sampling error was achieved.
