
Summary of Alternatives

Proposed Action

Fuels Reduction Treatment within and adjacent to the Powderhorn Wilderness area and WSA

- Total Project Area: 90,725
- 36, 819 Acre Project area where mechanical, timber sale, prescribed fire and manual treatments are proposed outside the wilderness
- 53,877 acres inside the Wilderness and W.S.A.. Where prescribed fire and manual treatments are proposed.

Crystal Creek	7,427
Wilderness WSA	53,877

Project Objectives


- Mimic small-scale disturbance on the landscape
- Improve timber stand resiliency against catastrophic fires




Past Treatments

- Fire
- Timber Sales
- Mastication
- Over 9,000 acres of past treatments
- Past Timber Sales Only Health Stands of Englemann Spruce




Spruce Beetle Outbreak Map



Vegetation Condition Assessment

- Mid- to late-successional stands & lack of early-successional stands.
- Overstocked stands
- Notable lack of regeneration.
- 57% Surplus Condition based on VCA (models departure from current to presumed historic successional class distribution).

FIRE STARTS 2010 - 2018




Proposed Action

Rationale for selection of the Proposed Action as the BLM's preferred Alternative:

- Seeks to re-introduce fire to a fire adapted landscape.
- Strategic fuels reduction can improve the capacity for fire managed for resource benefits across the entire landscape.
- Enhances firefighter and public safety as well as Wilderness, recreation, wildlife and scenic values within the project area Meets objectives of the Gunnsion Resource Area RMP (1993)
