BLM Primitive Camping Information

Moab receives nearly 3 million visitors per year which creates a high demand for campsites. To protect your public lands, the BLM Moab Field Office has many developed campgrounds to meet your needs. For those looking or a more primitive experience, there are areas outside of Moab zoned "Designated Dispersed" and "Dispersed" where minimum impact camping is allowed, but restrictions apply. Download the Moab Camping GeoPDF map to your phone using the AVENZA Maps application to identify where these areas are located. We need your help to keep these areas open, accessible and healthy.

- Vehicle must stay on road
- Human waste carryout required
- Pack it in, pack it out!
- No wood cutting or gathering
- Do not build new fire rings
- Do not mark on rocks
