16 Road Red Gravel Community Pit

Red and maroon sandstone clinker and hardened shale are the rock mineral materials available for disposal at the BLM 16 Road Red Gravel Community Pit site. The rock material is durable and suitable for road base or landscaping purposes. Unsorted piles of sharply angular cobble to gravel-sized material are found at the base of excavated areas along the canyon wall.

Material can be purchased from the BLM 16 Road Red Gravel Community Pit for \$2.63 a cubic yard, and a reclamation fee of \$0.30 per cubic yard sold. A contract of sales is obtained from the Bureau of Land Management at the Grand Junction Field Office located at 2815 H Rd, Grand Junction, CO 81506. Heavy equipment used must be authorized in the contract. Excavation and removal activities are not permitted during wet or muddy conditions. The site can be reached by 2-wheel drive vehicle, but spring runoff or storms may occasionally wash out the access across Big Salt Wash creek. The BLM does not guarantee in any way, access into or out of the pit site.

Directions from Grand Junction: Take US Hwy 50 to Fruita and turn north onto 16 Road. Travel 16.8 miles north into the Book Cliffs to the 16 Road Red Gravel site turn-off marked with a brown sign. Turn right (east) onto the access road that crosses Big Salt Wash and leads to the site on the east side of the creek.
