

Commodity: Aggregate dacite, var. sizes, unsorted.

ACCESS

Access to the site is accessible by high clearance vehicles. Travel west on CR T off U.S. 285 for a little over 3.5 miles. At the kiosks, stay right on CR T45.5 for 2.25 miles. Take a right, travel northwest until the end of that road. Take a left and travel for 0.3 miles and turn right to the site.




GEOLOGY

The community pit is located on the southern flank of the Tracy volcano, one of the pre-ignimbrite

central volcanoes active between 31.6 and 33.5 Ma. The material is mapped by Lipman (2020) as small-phenocryst dacite with sparse phenocrysts (mineral crystals) and lots of fine grained ground mass-gray unit below Tyds.

The dacite is intruded by dark gray andesite (Tyid), phenocrystic dacite (Tyid) dikes, noted in the geologic map below as blue stripes through the gray in the geologic map below.



RULES

A contract is required

- Limit use to designated roads and trails.
- Removal of materials from the stockpiles only.
- No digging.
- Use of equipment is permitted, equipment must be cleaned using a pressure washer prior to entry to avoid the spread of noxious weeds.
- Adhere to state and federal rules, including weight restrictions and speed regulations.
- If purchaser violates provisions of the permit they may lose their future rights to remove materials.
- No trash receptacles, haul your trash offsite.
