



North Henry Mtn Campgrounds

McMillan Springs: A campground nestled in the ponderosas with views overlooking the waterpocket fold. There are 9 sites with 2 pit toilets, water is available spring through fall. It is an equestrian-friendly campground providing three sizeable corrals equipped with watering troughs. Sites are available on a first come first served non-reservable basis. Campground fees are not a fixed rate, BLM asks you to pay what you believe your experience is worth. All proceeds support your public lands in Henry Mountains area directly.

Lonesome Beaver: A secluded creekside campground with ample shade in a grove of aspen trees. Access can be difficult as the Lonesome Beaver road is substantially rocky and narrow, a four-wheel drive vehicle with sturdy tires is recommended. There are 5 sites, all equipped with fire rings, grills, and benches. Pit toilets are available at the campground as well as the Dandelion Flat day-use area. Potable water is available spring through fall. Campground fees are not a fixed rate we encourage you to pay what you believe your experience is worth, proceeds support your public lands in Henry Mountains area directly.

- These campgrounds are in high elevation locations and may not be accessible in winter.
- Many routes are not marked and require navigation skills. GPS and maps are recommended as cell coverage is sparse in the region.
- Most roads in this area are clay-based and can become impassable quickly after rain and snow, always check the weather forecast.
- Stay on designated routes. Practice responsible Leave No Trace principles & Tread Lightly These campgrounds do not have trash services, pack it in pack it out!

Getting There

To McMillan Springs via Sandy Ranch

The most common route to McMillan starts by taking the Notom-Bullfrog road located just outside of Capitol Reef National Park for 13.5 miles to the Sandy Ranch Jct. Take BLM Rd #1400 for 16.5 miles, this stretch can be rocky and bumpy but is generally passable to high clearance vehicles under normal conditions. The signed junction will point you to McMillan Springs on BLM Rd #14450 the campground will be on the left 2.5 miles in.

To Lonesome Beaver via Sawmill Basin Road

Lonesome Beaver is located 23 miles south of Hanksville on BLM Rd #0096 which can be accessed in two ways; by the Fairview Ranch Road off Hwy 95 just beyond mile marker 10, or by taking 100 East in Hanksville. The road will become rocky as it ascends the mountain requiring a high clearance vehicle.
