



Starr Springs Campground

A campground shaded by a healthy stand of oaks. There are 9 sites with 2 pit toilets, 1 larger group site, water is available spring through fall. Sites are available on a first come first served non-reservable basis. Campground fees are \$10 a night for standard sites and \$20 for group site, fees are 1/2 price for golden age passport holders. Maximum length of stay is 14 days.

Across the way from the fee kiosk begins the Panoramic Trail, a short .75 mile loop trail offering great views towards the Little Rockies.

- These campgrounds are in high elevation locations and may not be accessible in winter.
- Many routes are not marked and require navigation skills. GPS and maps are recommended as cell coverage is sparse in the region.
- Most roads in this area are clay-based and can become impassable quickly after rain and snow, always check the weather forecast.
- Stay on designated routes. Practice responsible Leave No Trace principles & Tread Lightly These campgrounds do not have trash services, pack it in pack it out!

Getting There

From Hanksville

Take Hwy 95 South for 26 miles to the junction of Hwy 276.

Hwy 276

Turn right onto Hwy 276 towards Bullfrog and Lake Powell for 17 miles.

BLM Rd #13900

This is a dirt road signed for the Starr Springs Campground at its junction with the highway shortly after mile marker 17. The last 3.3 miles to the campground are often washboarded but passable to most vehicles in dry conditions.
