TEMPORARY CLOSURE ORDER

NOTICE OF TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF LANGS PEAK ROAD

July 31, 2026

OFFICE: Ukiah Field Office, Central California District, CA

ACTION: Temporary closure of Langs Peak Road to Motorized Vehicles.

SUMMARY: Langs Peak Road between the Junction of County Road 40 (4 corners area) and the BLM Buck Island Campground (Approximately 5.5 miles in length) will remain closed to street-legal and off-road motorized vehicles for public safety from August 1, 2026, through July 31, 2027, or until impassable road conditions are mitigated and deemed safe for public travel.

RATIONALE: This order is consistent with 43 CFR 8364.1(a), which provides for issuance of temporary closure orders on public lands to protect persons, property and public lands, by restricting vehicle access.

LOCATION: The closure is for Ukiah BLM Field Office federally managed lands from the junction of County Rd. 40 and Langs Peak Road, and along the entire length of Langs Peak Rd. to BLM Buck Island Campground.

DATES: This closure is effective August 1, 2026, and will remain in effect until July 31, 2027.

NOTIFICATION METHODS AND POSTING LOCATIONS: Notice Posted on multiple sandwich board closure signs at the junction of County Rd. 40 and Langs Peak Rd. Posted on BLM website, <https://www.blm.gov/programs/national-conservation-lands/california/berryessa-snow-mountain-national-monument>

EXEMPTIONS: The following persons are exempt from the provisions of this Order:

1. Any federal, State, or Local Officer, or member of an organized medical, rescue or firefighting force engaged in fire, emergency, or law enforcement activities, or public utility employees engaged in emergency repairs.
2. BLM employees, contractors, or agents engaged in official duties:
3. Individuals operating within the scope of their official and legitimate governmental duties.
4. Parties who carry written approval signed by the BLM Authorized Officer allowing access to the described public lands.

Penalties: Any person who violates this may be tried before a United States Magistrate and fined in accordance with 18 U.S.C. 3571, imprisoned for no more than 12 months, or both. In accordance with 43 CFR 8365.1–7, State or local officials may also impose penalties for violations of State law.
