Data for fiscal year 1976, which under the old system extended from July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, were published in the preceding edition of BLM Facts.

Data for July, August, and September, 1976, the transition quarter (TQ) bridging the gap between the old fiscal year 1976 and the new fiscal year 1977, are also published in this edition of BLM Facts to complete the record of transactions.
