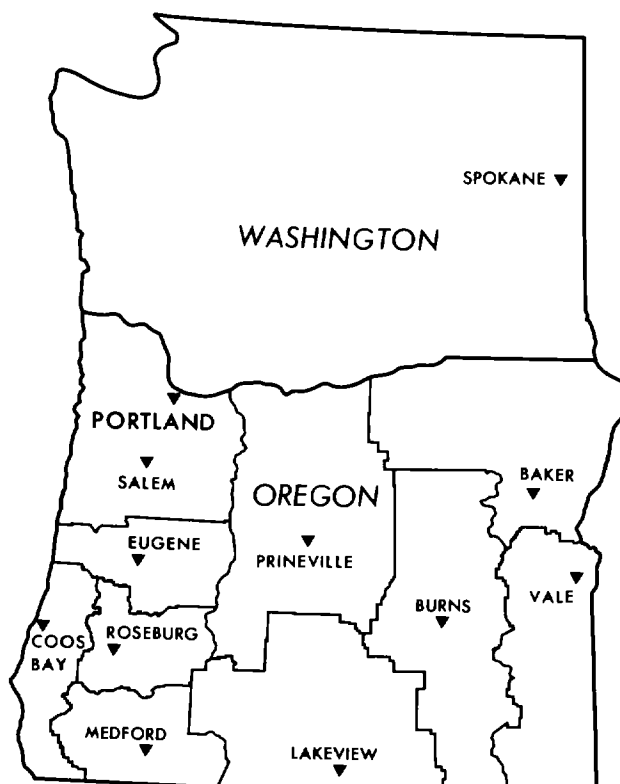

LAND & WATER CONSERVATION FUND GRANTS

Most of the money in the Land & Conservation Fund is from receipts collected from Bureau of Land Management oil and gas leases on the outer continental shelf.
