Insect Safari

Get to know the insects who live in your area on an insect safari! As you search for bugs, practice respectful behavior: hold insects gently and release them when you are done.

Try searching in the following places:

- Fields and meadows. Keep an eye out for fliers and hoppers.
- **Leaves.** Look on and under leaves for insects and insect evidence, such as eggs or strange bumps, called galls.
- **Fallen trees.** Roll over logs and peel back bark to uncover insects.
- Soil. Dig in the dirt to find critters that live beneath the surface.

NOTE: If you encounter bees, wasps, or other stinging insects, remember to "bee calm!" Stay still, take deep breaths, and wait until the stinging insect moves away.

Build a Bug

Design an insect with natural materials. For ideas and inspiration, think about the bugs you found on your insect safari!

As you build your bug, imagine:

- Where does the bug live?
- How does the bug move?
- What does the bug eat?
- How does the bug **protect** itself?

Be sure to give your bug a name!













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
