#### **Statement**

"The BLM manages 27 national monuments spanning approximately 9.5 million acres in 10 Western states. We look forward to supporting the President's priorities and the direction the Secretary of the Interior provides regarding today's Executive Order. For any additional information please contact the Department of the Interior."

#### **Background**

The BLM is one of four Federal land management agencies that manage national monuments. Two BLM-managed monuments were designated through acts of Congress (Prehistoric Pathways in New Mexico and Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains in California), while the other 25 were all established by Presidential proclamation under the Antiquities Act. The designating documents set forth which natural or cultural resource value the monument is being established to protect.
