Hi Skye, Sally asked me to follow up on the discussion you and Sally had earlier today. Based on that conversation, the language in the GSENM draft MMP-A briefing paper and Alt E of the draft MMP-A will be updated to remove the "in balance" language and will use language that stays true to the language of the proclamation.

The GSENM proclamation language: *Nothing in this proclamation shall be deemed to affect existing permits or leases for, or levels of, livestock grazing on Federal lands within the monument; existing grazing uses shall continue to be governed by applicable laws and regulations other than this proclamation.*

"In balance" language to be removed (p. 2-38 and as needed throughout MMP-A): *Given that the Proclamation provides the BLM with the discretion to continue livestock grazing in balance with managing objects identified in the Proclamation, Alternative E provides a balance of livestock grazing that recognizes the importance of ranching to the local custom and culture with management of Monument objects.*
