Jerry,

In general for forestry related data-calls, Abe provides data on what we have done in the timber sale program, and the fairly immediate actual timber sale plan (what is currently planned by the Districts). He is the data steward for TSIS.

I provide data on what we planned to do (i.e. in the RMP's for WO). This is generally bigger picture (what-if scenarios). I provide any long range projections.. what was the projected volume in the next 50 years...? I usually use the RMP modeling data and also Microstorms (I'm the M*S data steward)

So, for this request, per my reading, Abe should answer questions 2d and 3d, and I answer question 4d.

I completely concur that data consistency is paramount. To my knowledge, the report that I attached is what has been used to quantify the longer-term impact's to the BLM's timber program from the CSME. It has certainly been shared with our lawyers, I wasn't actually involved in those conversations, so I'm not completely clear on it's use.

I hope that is helpful.

Hi all,

Attached are the corrected forms for the NM Data Call. Mostly corrections to numbering and lettering order, but I want to make sure we use the latest.

As you may have heard, WO clarified that State responses are due on May 31 to give them 2 days for WO oversight and submittal to DOI by June 2nd. So we'll need to have combined answers to each question by May 31 (requiring sharing of all needed info before that date). There was a strong hint for states w/ only one Monument to submit their info before May 31, so we'll do our best. Here are some highlights of Monday's nat'l conf call:

- I asked WO about our plan to distinguish the original Monument from the Expansion Area for all or most questions where the answers are very different (e.g., timber harvest, livestock grazing, energy infrastructure), and they agreed it would be a good idea. It becomes necessary anyway for the "5 yrs prior" questions, as each piece has a different timeframe.
- WO reiterated that we are not expected to create new data. We only provide what is already available and say when we don't have the necessary info to answer a certain question.
- The Bears Ears example distributed previously provides a model for dealing with the LUP questions when the Monument lands have not yet been subjected to a Monument specific RMP, so we'll follow that lead for the Expansion Area (OR and CA). We'll upload each pertinent RMP into the Drive site (uploading to the site I sent out and then I have permission to add it to the nat'l site). They like having both the doc in the Drive plus a link to the doc online.
- In the "Additional Questions" handout, we can use the boilerplate language if we don't have anything specific

to add. So for item (b), which is specific to cultural resources, we only add specifics about any particular cult res law if something very specific about them has been applied to this Monument. And we only mention ACECs under this question if they are for cult res purposes. I don't believe any of ours relate specifically to cult resources.

- In item (c), we only have the Soda Mtn Wilderness (no WSAs. I don't believe there are any LWCs on the OR side).
- For those docs that we upload to the nat'l site, DOI appreciates starting the filenames w/ the Question number (e.g., Q 1b Record of Decision for...)
- WO is excerpting economic report text pertinent to each of our NMs and uploading to our Drive folders, so we don't have to do that (although I don't see where it's being asked for. The report is tied to visitation).
- WO advised that if you need NOC assistance with RAS data for our unit, contact Lynnda Jackson (150jacks@blm.gov) right away. (I just rec'd a link to data from Lynnda via Tim Fisher which I'm forwarding to you under separate cover. She must be trying to shortcut the inquiries.)

I believe this is what we have to work with for now. I'll fwd Lynnda's link in the next email.

Please let me know if you have other questions.
