## **Range of Options for Review of National Monuments**

This list illustrates generic examples along a spectrum of choices. There is no priority to the order in which options appear on this list. Revisions to boundaries and allowable uses might be proposed to occur through Executive or Legislative action. It is not practical to list all potential options.

Expand a monument to more fully protect resources listed in the establishing or expansion Proclamation.

Expand a monument to protect important resources not listed in the establishing or expansion Proclamation.

Revise a monument boundary to remove areas not required to protect Proclamation resources.

Revise a Monument management plan to permit recreational activities not prohibited by the Proclamation but not provided for in the current management plan.

Revise a Monument Proclamation to permit uses such as recreational hunting and fishing, grazing or camping) prohibited in the Proclamation while maintaining protection for original or expansion Proclamation Resources.

Revise a Proclamation and/or a monument boundary to exclude areas that do not contain "historic landmarks, historic and prehistoric structures, [or] other objects of historic or scientific interest" as provided in the Antiquities Act.

Revise a Proclamation and/or a monument boundary to permit important potential economic uses of the land that are prohibited by the original or expansion Proclamation.

Revoke a Proclamation on grounds that the resources to be protected in the original or expansion Proclamation did not meet the criteria set forth in the Antiquities Act, or no longer exist within the Monument

Revoke a Proclamation on grounds that the resources protected in the original or expansion Proclamation are less important than economic uses that could occur if the area was not a monument.

Take no action.
