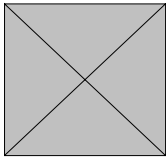

Hi Morgan—

This is follow-up to the voice message I just left you regarding the listening session in Phoenix last Thursday.

As indicated in the emails below, we asked our Regional Lands Director Kathryn Conant and Tami Connor (both from Utah) to attend the Phoenix listening session on behalf of the FS.

Unfortunately, Kathryn was not invited to sit at the federal representative panelist table and/or included in introductions of federal representatives, even though you included her on your list below and after she explained to the on-site organizers that she was there as the FS' lead representative. Kathryn and Tami were both asked to sign in as guests with other session attendees and were asked to sit toward the front of the session.

My understanding is that BLM's Ken Mahoney, Indian Affairs' Miles Jensen, and BIA's Hankie Ortis were seated at the panelist table. As the Bears Ears monument was the main focus of comments, this is particularly unfortunate since the FS co-manages the monument with BLM and has worked diligently to build and foster productive relationships with associated tribes.

After the session, Kathryn did reach out to individually introduce herself to members of each of the 6 tribes that attended and thank them for attending.

I don't know if you were aware of this and hope you find this input helpful. Please clarify the intent here and also for the Connecticut session on June 12th, as we are currently verifying our agency representative for that session.
