Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument Artist-in-Residence Program 2025

The Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Artist-in-Residence Program at Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument offers artists the opportunity to enrich public appreciation of BLM lands. Through their unique perspectives, artists contribute to the public's understanding of natural, cultural, and historical sites. This program welcomes writers, composers, and visual and performing artists to engage in their craft amidst inspiring landscapes during a one to two-week summer residency in the month of June.

Participants are asked to donate an original artwork piece, which they will retain the rights to, by September 30, 2025. This artwork should align with the monument's mission and may be used for exhibits, educational purposes, and non-profit partner products like postcards or posters. Artists are also required to present their work publicly during their residency.

Last year's Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument Artist-in-Residence was Serena Richelle, a scientific illustrator who spent her time studying and sketching the Monument's unique species. Prospective applicants can see her describe her experience: <https://youtu.be/zOjo6jSMJvI>

___ Resume: Please provide a professional resume, including exhibition record, fellowships & residencies, and other honors; not to exceed two pages in length.

___ Residency Proposal: not to exceed one page in length.

Your proposal must address:

- Why you are interested in an AIR residency in Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument
- Relevance of your project to BLM AIR program goals
- Potential for development of your professional growth/interests
- Your experience with outdoor activities
