## FIRE PREVENTION ORDER # NM010-18-01 (LLNMF01000)

Pursuant to 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) §9212.2(a), the following acts are prohibited on all lands administered by the BLM Farmington District within San Juan County.

This order shall go into effect at 12:01 a.m., MDT, May 26, 2018 and will remain in effect until further notice.

### **Prohibited Acts:**

- 1. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove other than in developed sites and areas.
- 2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed sites and areas, or while stopped in an area at least 3 feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
- 3. Discharging, using, or possessing fireworks.
- 4. Discharging steel-core, steel-tipped, or steel-jacketed firearm ammunition, or using a tracer or incendiary bullet or device.
- 5. Discharging, using, or possessing any combustible or explosive composition, or any substance or combination of substances or article prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration, or detonation. This includes, but is not limited to, fireworks, pyrotechnics, or exploding targets.

### **Exempted:**

Any federal, state, local and/or military employee acting within the scope of their duties; members of any organized rescue or firefighting force performing official duty; and persons, agencies, municipalities or companies with a written permit that specifically authorizes the otherwise prohibited act. An exemption does not absolve an individual or organization from liability or responsibility for any fire started by an exempted activity.

#### **Penalties:**

Pursuant to Title 43 CFR §9212.4, any violation of this order is subject to punishment by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment of not more than 12 months or both. Restitution for total costs of fire suppression or damage will be borne by the violator.
