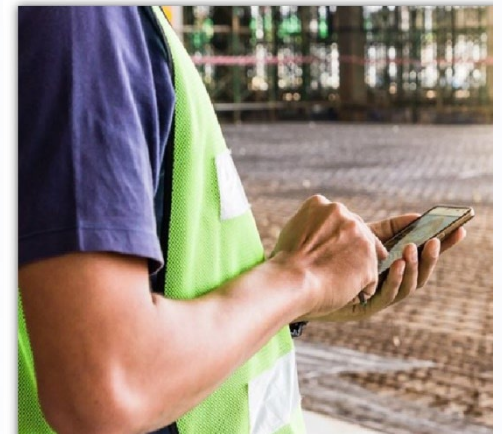

The S1 Mobile Mapper GIS Program Mission:

- To create an easy to use, integrated **Mobile** GIS data collection platform.
- To **support agency personnel** in facilitating viewing, capturing and editing of geospatial resource data.
- To use **Modern** mobile devices in a **Disconnected** network environment.

S1 Mobile Mapper App Overview

- **ArcGIS Online (AGOL) for Organizations account access is the backbone of data collection**
 - S1 Mobile Mapper App and other mobile data collection apps.
 - Internet access: Download data and sync collected data back to AGOL.
- **Offline workflows for field data collection (no internet connection).**
 - Collect points, line and polygons in the field and add attribute information.
- **Downloads, Displays, and Advantages:**
 - Supports a variety of basemap file types: .tpk, .tpkx, .vtpk and GeoTiff.
 - Supports many basemap downloads (only limited by storage space) in addition to the Default basemap.
 - Supports managing S1 content on the mobile device.
 - S1 Mobile Mapper has some advanced tools: Nested features, buffer, navigation tools, etc.
 - Hosted or On-Premise Feature Services, Web Maps and Mobile Map Packages (.mmpk are read only).
 - Supports some Field Maps [smart forms](#) functionality, for example, conditional statements using Arcade expressions, attribute field grouping, and subtitle text.
 - **Advantage:** Custom workflows to edit corporate themes with QA/QC capability (Sync & Submit).
 - **Advantage:** In-house app customization-Driven by [S1 Mobile Mapper Feedback & Ideas Page](#) submitted by app users. This allows flexible content management that can address user issues quickly.
 - **Advantage: Ad Hoc data collection options** (allows for unplanned data capture): Waypoints, Tracklogs, GeoTagged Photos, Sketches



Common Terms to Know

Feature Class (ArcGIS Pro)

- Same spatial representation, such as all points, lines, or polygons. For example, “a feature class of points or a feature class of polygons”.
- Each feature class has its own set of attribute columns.

Feature Service - or Feature Layer (Hosted) Service (AGOL)

- Essentially this is the “editable data” available in the S1 Mobile Mapper app. Can be a standalone service or be included within a web map.
- Makes your data available for use in web clients, desktop apps, and field apps. Hosted on AGOL.

Layer

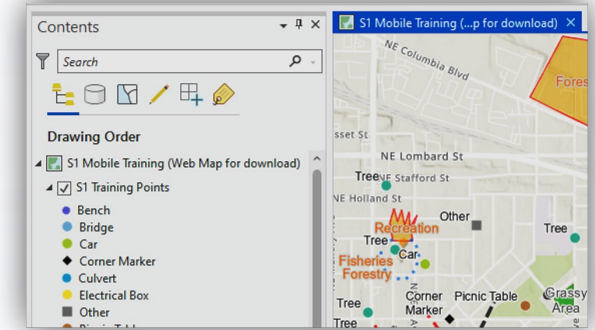
- Visual representation of a geographic dataset in any digital map environment. Examples: imagery layer (basemap), a point feature class layer, hosted web map layer, tile layer, etc.

Basemap

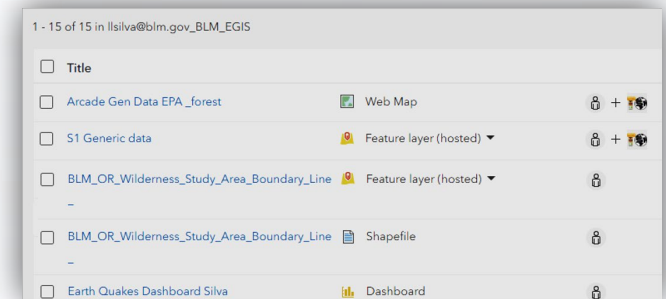
- Serves as a bottom reference map. The S1 Mobile Mapper app allows users to layer basemaps on top of each other with on-the-fly transparency adjustment functionality.
- Can be created by users as a TPK, TPKX, VTPK or GeoTiff file (published from ArcMap or ArcGIS Pro).
- Basemaps are the foundation for your maps and provide context for your work.

Web Map

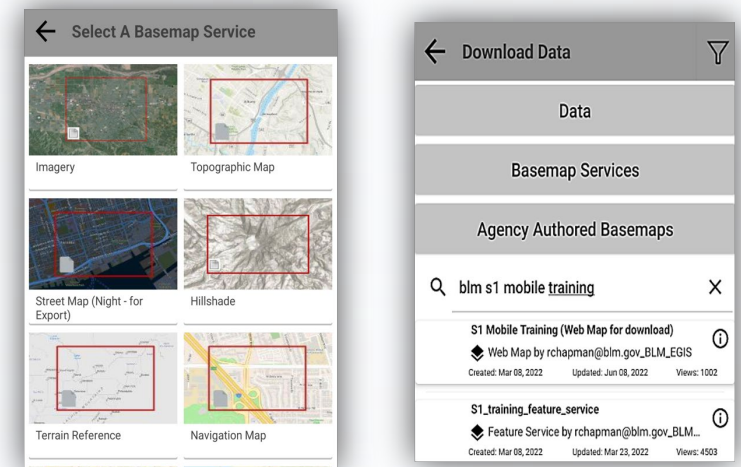
- Online maps created with ArcGIS Online, published from ArcMap or ArcGIS Pro, that provide a way to work and interact with geographic content organized as layers.
- **Shared on the web and across smartphones and tablets.** Each web map contains a basemap along with a set of additional data layers.



ArcGIS Pro - Feature Class with Subtypes

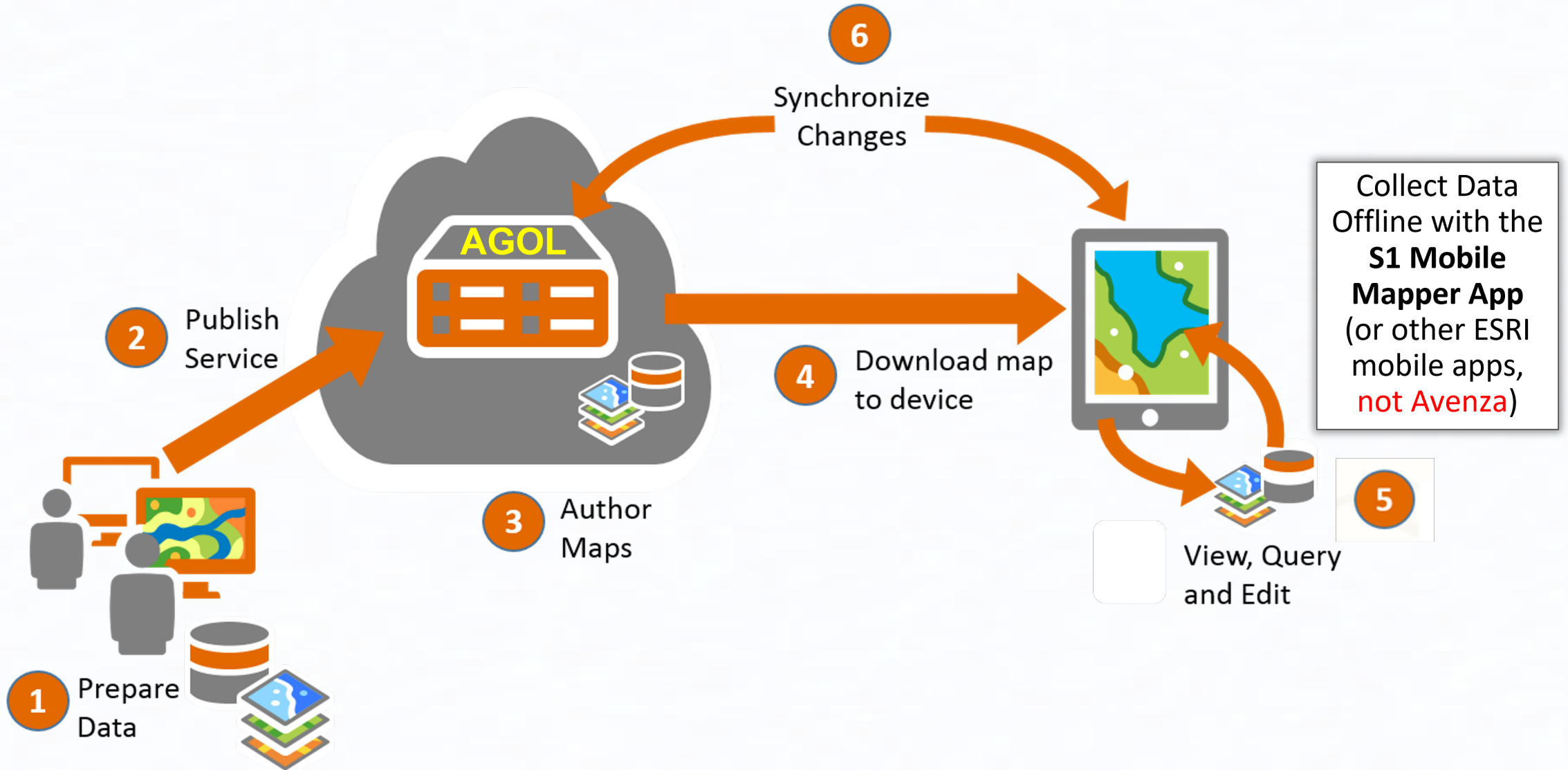

How we use ArcGIS Online (AGOL)



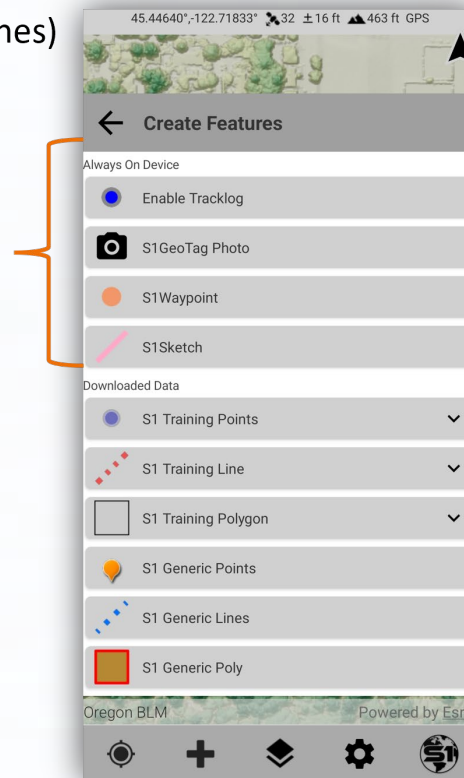
Hosted Feature Service -vs- S1 Ad-Hoc Options

Concept: Publish a hosted service that covers any potential basic data capture types, and always keep a copy on the mobile device for unforeseen data collection needs. Essentially, a hosted service instead with one button sync and immediate availability and access vs using Ad-Hoc data collection and manual process to get into GIS.

S1 Ad-Hoc Data

(waypoints, tracklogs, geotagged photos, sketches)

- Only resides on device unless user manually converts file.
- Limited attribute info: Name, Description, Lat-Long locations only. Add notes later?
- Quick to collect, long to process.
 1. Copy file off device
 2. Convert to useable data format for sharing or mapping
 3. Edit/add attributes
 4. Share to final location



ArcGIS Online Feature Service

- Download edit area to mobile device.
- Data syncs back to AGOL.
- Allows access to those that need it.
- Once setup, many ways to use the data.
- Always have access to collect unforeseen data types.
- No need to convert Json files.
- **Less steps with more detail and instant access once synced.**

WHAT IS IT?

The S1 Mobile Mapper is a custom mapping and field data collection application built for Android mobile devices by the Service First (S1) Mobile GIS team, sponsored by Bureau of Land Management, Oregon/Washington State Office and US Forest Service, Region 6.



WHY WOULD YOU USE IT?

Public Users

The S1 Mobile Mapper provides the public with a simple way to download and view BLM and U.S. Forest Service maps for use offline while enjoying recreational activities on public lands. The public version of the app also has the ability to navigate to user defined locations, collect Tracklogs, Waypoints, and GeoTag photos.

Agency Users

Given that agency field personnel commonly work in remote areas with no network access, this application's emphasis is on the display, collection and update of geospatial data and attributes in an office environment. Contact is

S1 Mobile Mapper Workflow – Downloads and Field Data Collections

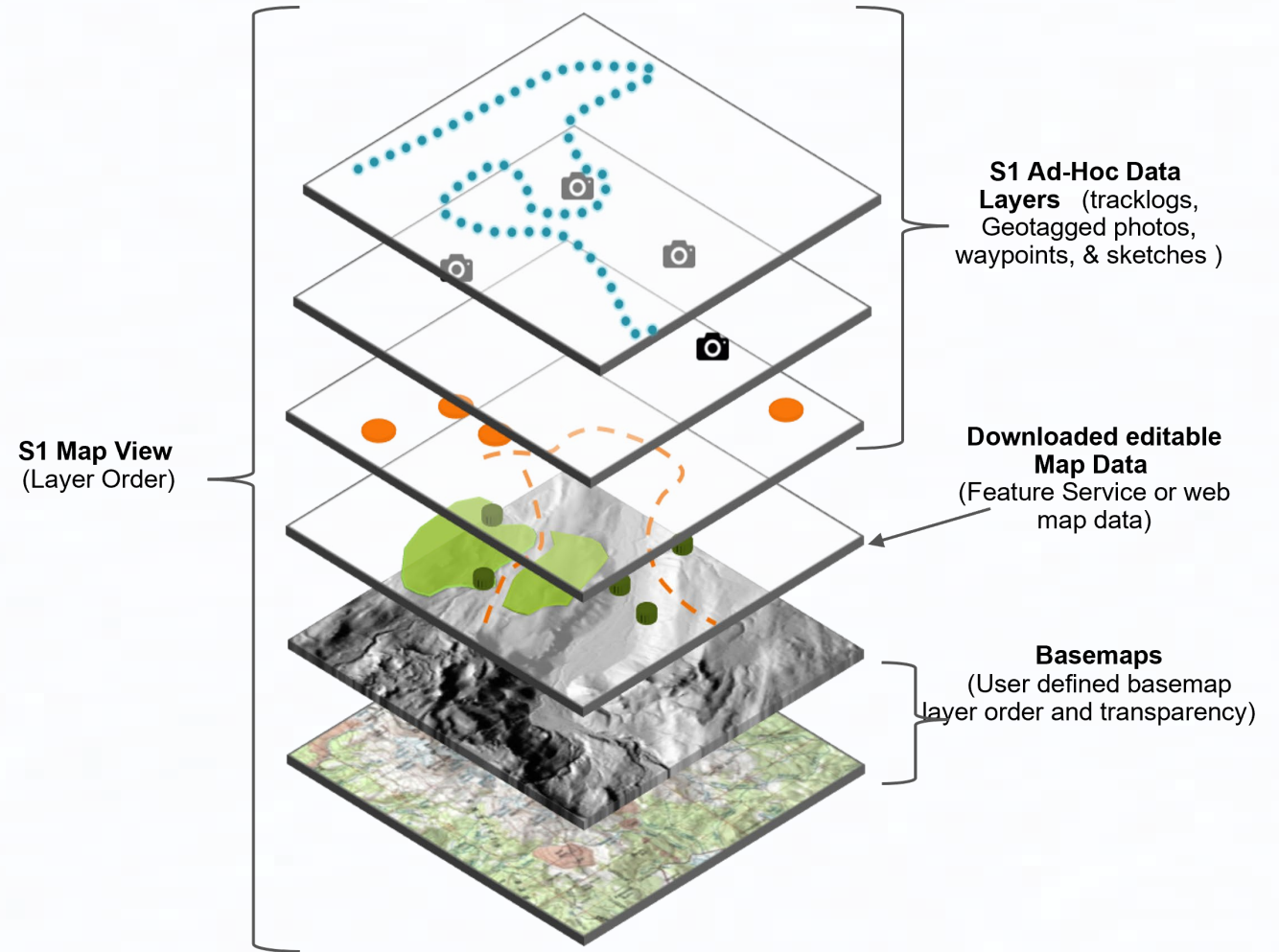
After device setup and creating services (Hosted on AGOL; web maps and feature layers, etc.)

1. Download and install the S1 Mobile Mapper app.
2. Download one or more basemaps or use the Default basemap.
3. Download data (internet service): download a feature service or a web map (editable) to use in the field.
4. Collect data offline in the field via GPS or digitizing.
5. Useful tools in the S1 Mobile Mapper App.
6. Sync data back to ArcGIS Online (AGOL).

S1 Mobile Mapper Layer Hierarchy & Key Concepts

Key S1 Concepts

- User can have multiple different editable databases downloaded to the device (*only limited by storage space*).
- **Only one** editable database can be displayed in the active map view at a time.
- Editable data in S1 can be either from standalone feature service downloads or packaged with other feature services via a web map (basemaps can also be downloaded with web maps if desired).
- Every layer (ad-hoc data, editable services & basemaps) can be toggled on/off or removed from the active map view as needed.
- User can have as many basemaps downloaded as they like (*only limited by storage space*).
- User can have as many basemaps layered in the active map view as they like and can adjust the basemap layer order & transparency as needed.
- The S1 Default basemap cannot be deleted from the device.



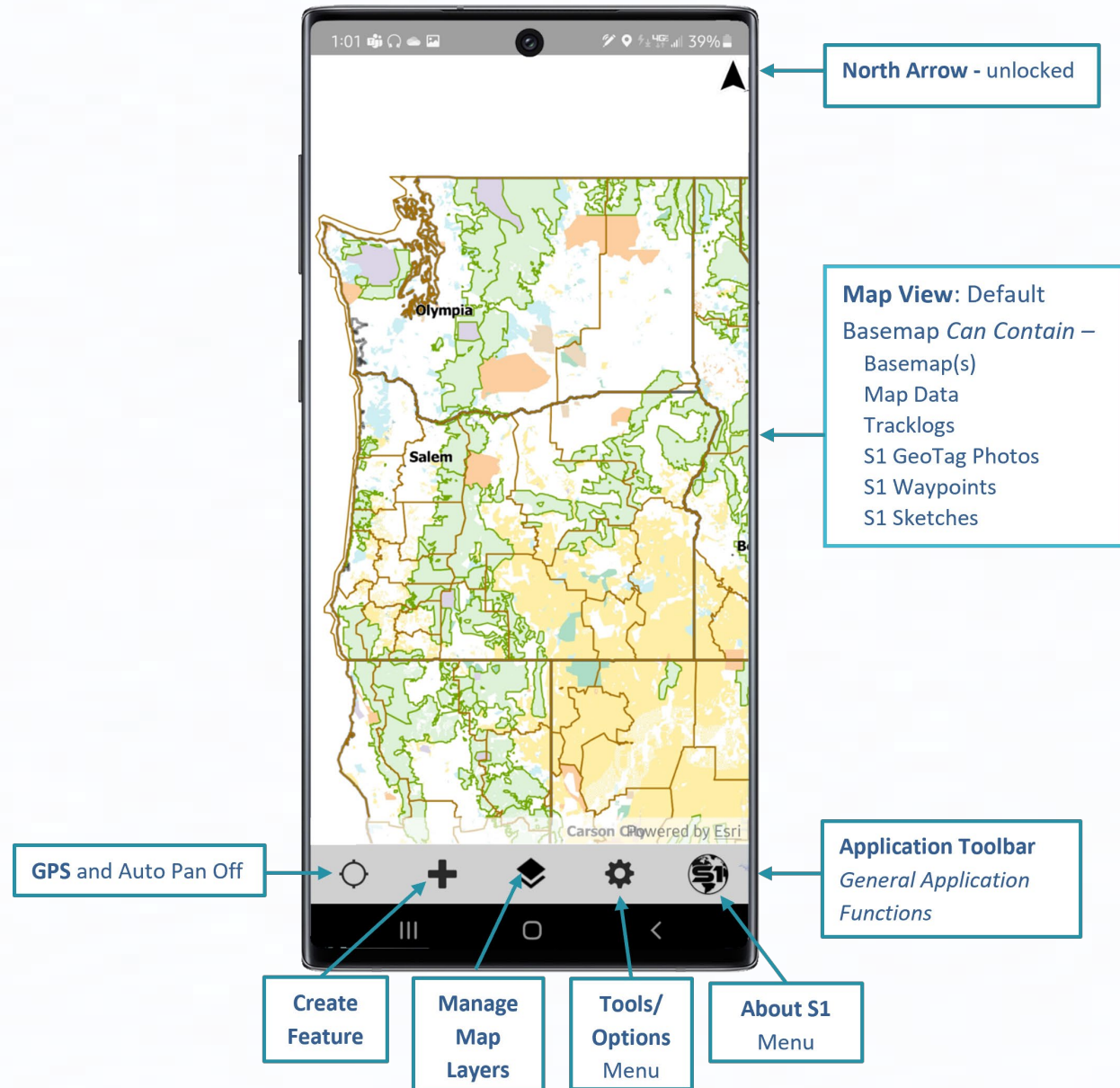

Multiple Basemap Downloads

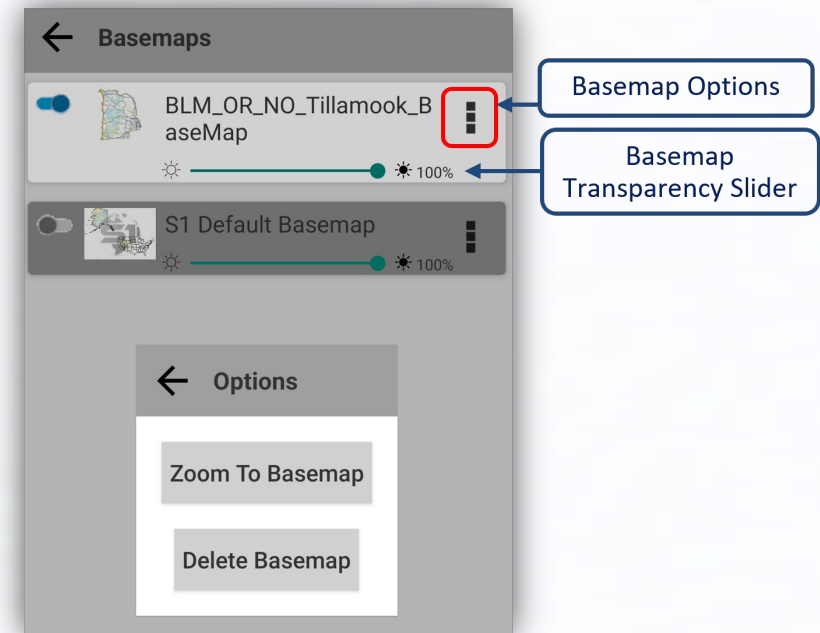
Note: Basemaps can also be added as a Data download via web map or from a .tpkx file.

Collect Feature via Digitizing - Interface

An example, can't reach a location by foot



What is Digitizing?

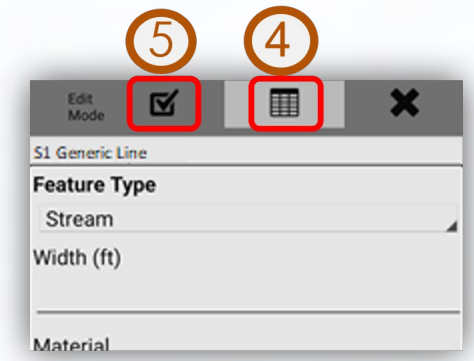
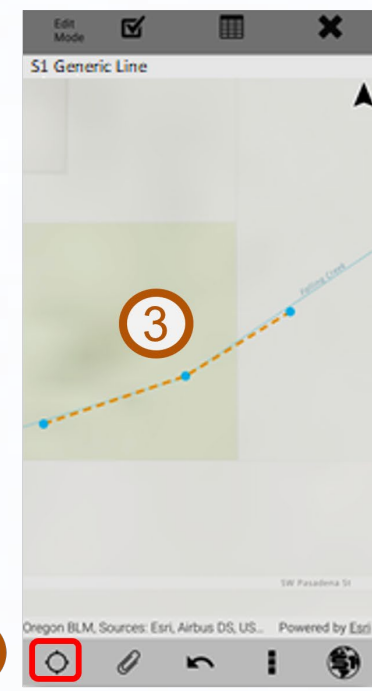
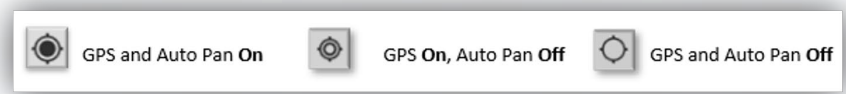
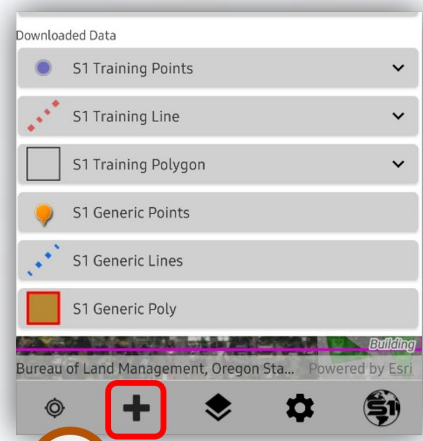
- Digitizing is adding a new feature with the GPS Off. Essentially drawing a point, line or polygon on the map and filling out the appropriate attributes.

When to Digitize?





- Poor satellite signal
- Can't reach a location by foot
- Need to transcribe data from another format

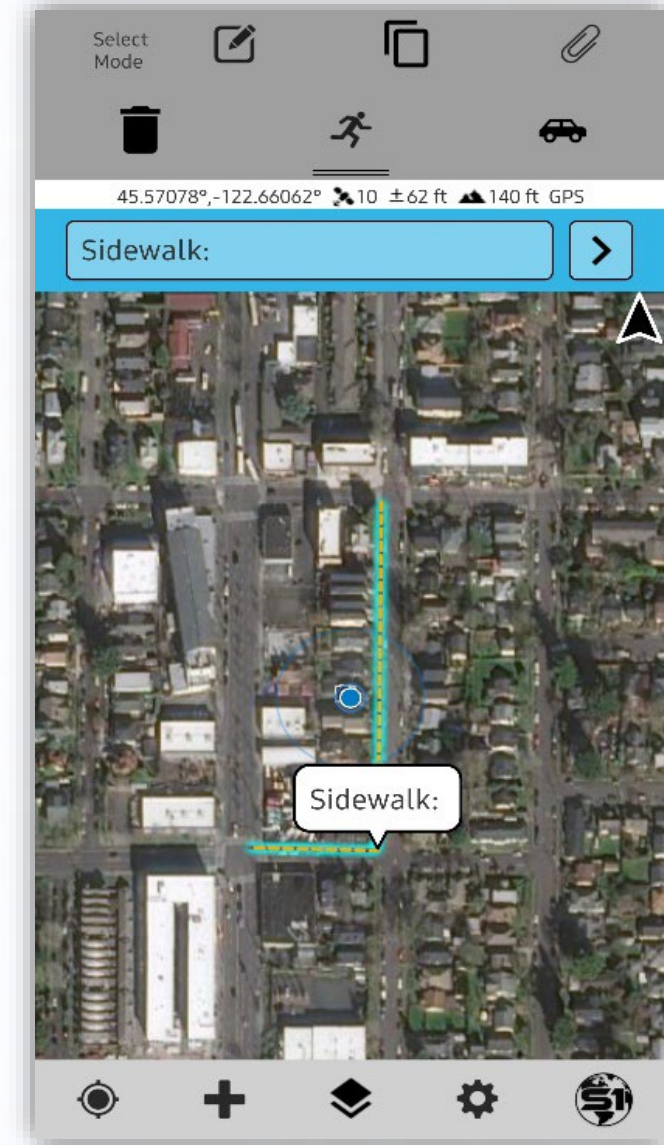
How to digitize in the S1 Mobile Mapper app:

1. Select the **Collect Feature** button
2. Confirm that GPS is turned off
3. Tap on map to digitize feature
4. Edit the attribute table
5. Submit feature



Select Mode - Interface

- Edit Feature > Edit Mode 
- Manage Attachments 
- Copy Geometry 
- Delete Feature 
- Navigate to Selected Feature 
- Route to Selected Feature 
- Feature Info Pop Up (blue bar & map popup)
- Tap blue bar
 - Tap arrow to see features if multiple features are selected



Collect lines or polygons via either Streaming or Averaging

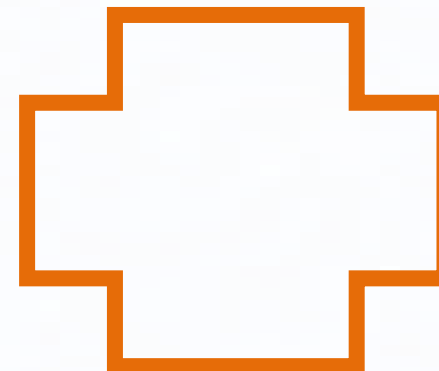
When to use one over the other?

- Speed vs. Accuracy
- Feature outline type
- Can Mix & Match Methods

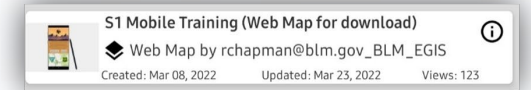
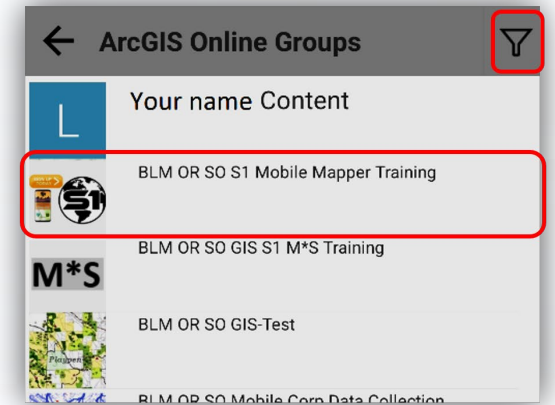
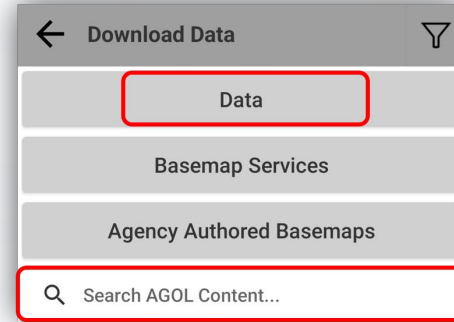
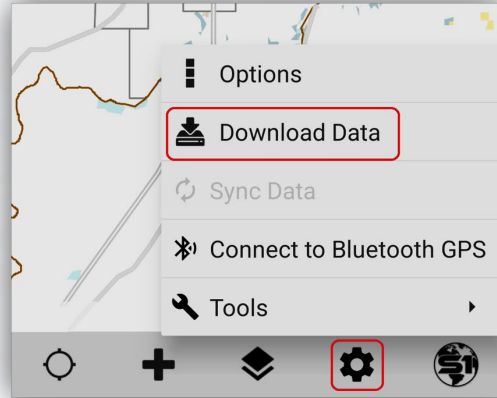
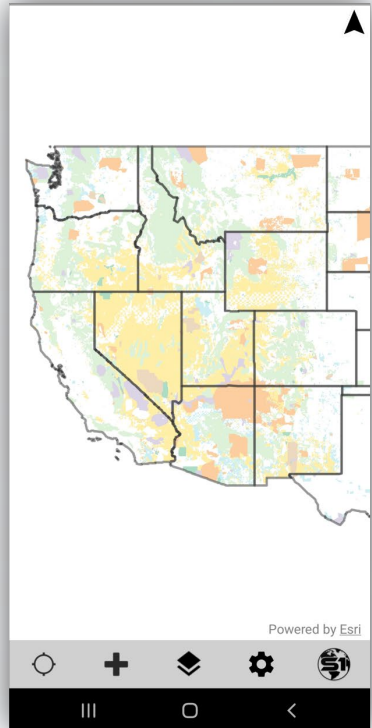
Streaming; Captures vertices at a user defined interval (time or distance) based on the GPS information at the time “no averaging”. Better for capturing data that does not have hard corners; trails, recreation areas, parking lots, etc.



Averaging; Uses a user defined number of vertices to average a final location coordinate. Best for features with straight lines and hard corners; property boundaries, building footprints, (inherently more accurate than streaming).

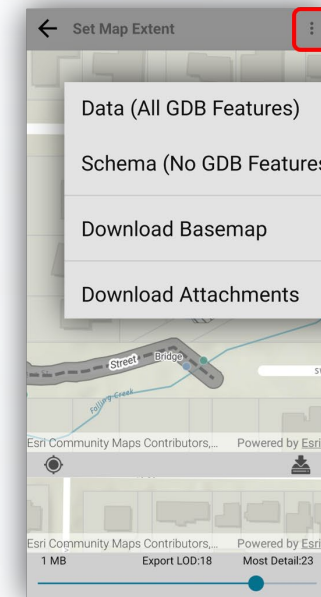


3. Download Data in S1 Mobile Mapper



Exercise 3: Download a Web Map

- Download **S1 Mobile Training (Web Map for Download)** for creating new features in the S1 Mobile Mapper app.
- Discussion includes filter, search, and download **options** of basemaps with the web map.



Managing Map Layers

Toggle on/off all map data labels

Name of the selected map data layer

Select Map Data thumbnail link to the list of downloaded data map(s)

Blue highlighted boundary indicates the currently displayed map data

Checkbox for options Remove, Delete or Recover map data

Link to map data symbology pulldown list

Toggle on/off layer visibility in the map

Link to symbology description for layer

Before You Head Out Into the Field

- ✓ Verify device is **fully charged**.
- ✓ Verify that all maps and data have been **downloaded**.
- ✓ Test your dataset prior to first offline field visit.
- ✓ Set device to **airplane mode** (conserve battery).
- ✓ Set location to **GPS ONLY**.
- ✓ Review **S1 Option** settings in office/in the field.

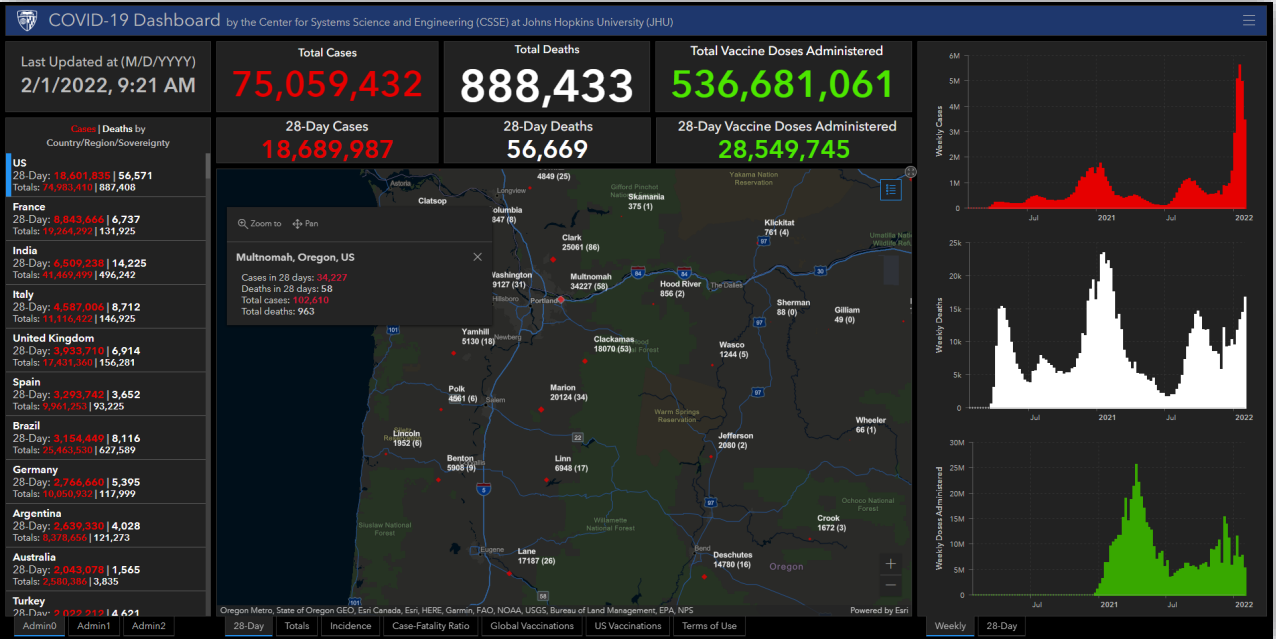
ArcGIS Dashboards -authored in ArcGIS Online (AGOL)

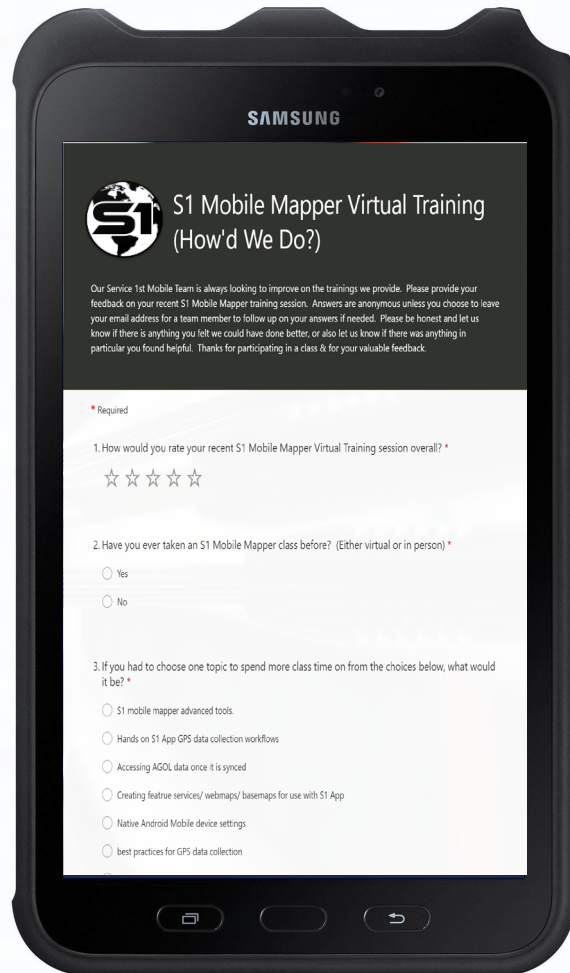
