Moonshine Arch Trail is a multi-use trail that is open to OHVs, bikes, hikers, equestrians, and leashed dogs.



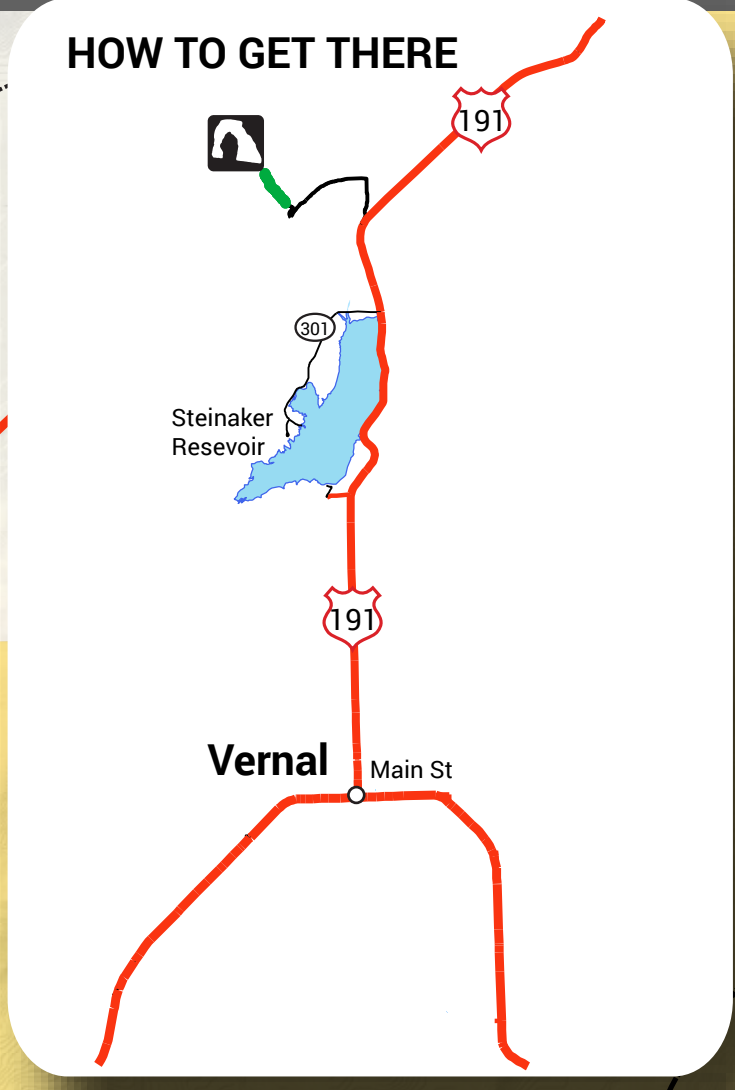
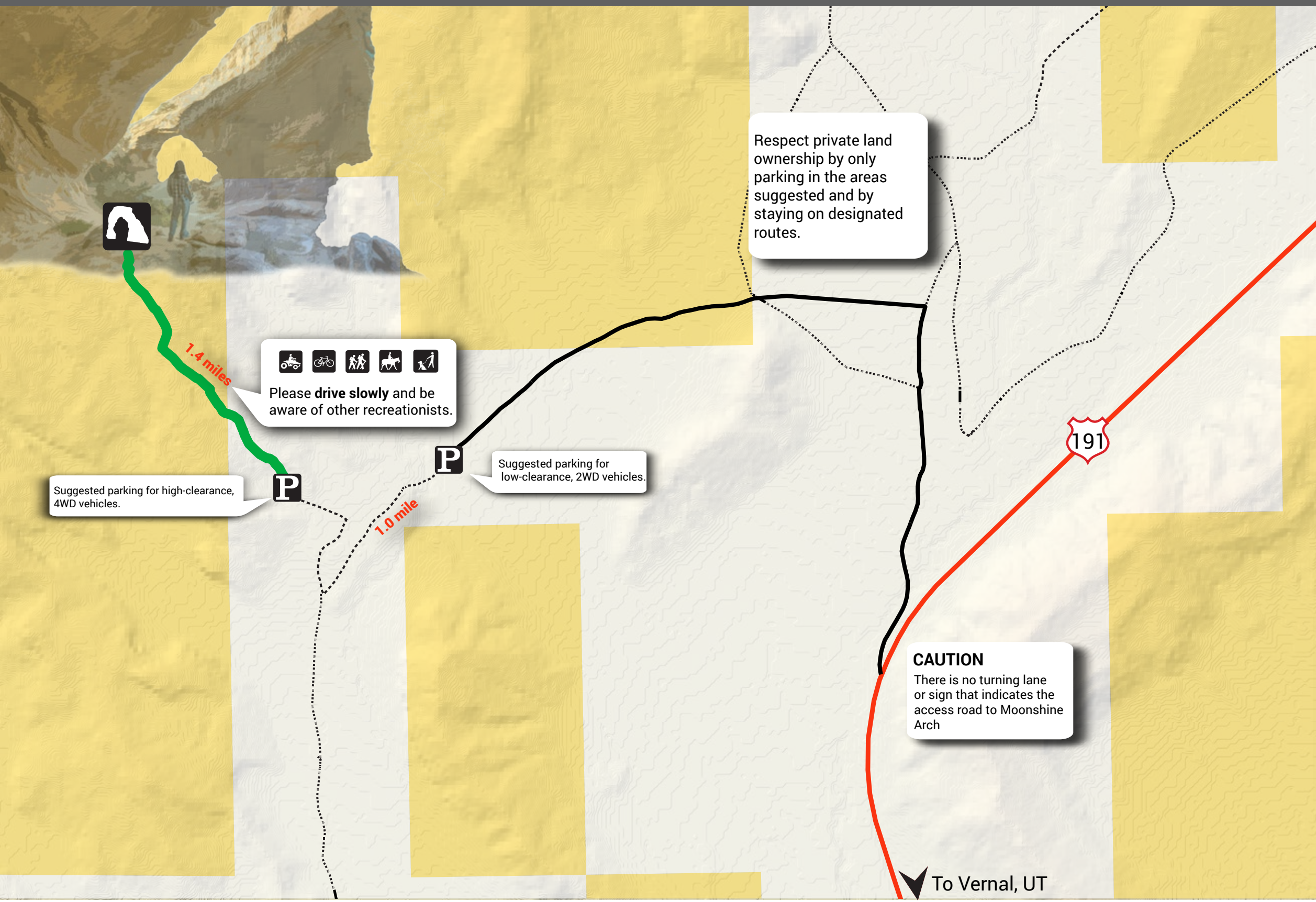

DIRECTIONS: From the intersection of Main Street and Vernal Ave, take Highway 191 north approximately 3.5 miles. Turn left onto the well-defined dirt road and travel for approximately 1.6 miles to the first undeveloped parking area. It is suggested for 2WD, low-clearance vehicles to park here and walk on the road to reach the trailhead. 4WD, high-clearance vehicles can continue another mile on the road to the second parking area.
