BLM Utah Administrative Map



Visitors to BLM Utah's public lands

In fiscal year 2017, there were **7.9 million visitors** to BLM-managed lands in Utah. These visitors supported **5,203 jobs** and contributed **\$577.7** million in economic activity to the state of Utah.





BLM Priorities

Energy Independence:

encouraging environmentallyresponsible development of energy and minerals on public lands;

Shared Conservation

Stewardship: by working with our partners to promote multiple-use on public lands;

Safe Borders: through effective management of the borderlands and cooperation with the Department of Defense on public land issues;

Job Creation: by supporting working landscapes; and

Serving America: by being good neighbors, supporting traditional land uses such as grazing, and providing access to hunting, fishing, and recreational opportunities.



Utah's Watershed Restoration Initiative

- Established in 2006
- Partner-driven effort to conserve, restore and manage ecosystems.
- To date, 1,902 projects have been completed, on 1,560,073 acres for an investment of \$207,054,212 throughout Utah.
- In FY17, the BLM contributed \$10.5 million in funding.
