



- Eco-Sanctuaries
- Three awards from the 12 ORP proposals; 900 new spaces are expected by October 2016
- New ORP solicitation opened March 10, 2016 and closes April 29, 2016: AR, CO, ID, IA, KS, MO, MT, NE, NM, ND, OK, OR, SD, UT, TX, WA and WY (200-5,000)
- TPEC (Technical Proposal Evaluation Committee)
- Overwhelming response

# Wild Horse and Burro Shade/Shelter for Adopters

- Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)
  - 43 C.F.R. § 4750.3-2(a) Qualification Standards for Private Maintenance
    - (3)(iii) Shelter shall be available to mitigate the effects of inclement weather and temperature extremes. The authorized officer may require that the shelter be a structure, which shall be well drained and adequately ventilated.


