

**DECISION RECORD  
and  
FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

I. Decision:

Based on the analysis and evaluation of the environmental assessment, it is my decision to authorize the Proposed Action to Ben Rowe, dba Twin PeaksAdventures, LLC, for a Special Recreation Permit to conduct commercial fish guiding on BLM administered lands in the Tubutulik River drainage within Townships 5 & 6 South, Range 17 West., K.R.M. and the Cobblestone River drainage within Township 5 South, Range 34 West, K.R.M. and Township 6 South, Range 33 West, K.R.M.

The mitigation measures adopted from the EA as stipulations are attached to the permit.

II. Rationale for the Decision:

The lands described in the analysis are included in the Northwest Management Framework Plan (MFP) dated October 5, 1982. Under the Recreation (R-1) objective, it states that BLM will provide recreational opportunities appropriate to the needs of visitors.

III. Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI):

Based on the analysis of potential environmental impacts contained in the attached environmental assessment, I have determined that impacts are not expected to be significant and an environmental impact statement is not required.

IV. ANILCA Section 810 Compliance:

The decision will not significantly restrict subsistence uses, decrease the abundance of subsistence resources, alter the distribution of subsistence resources, or limit subsistence user access from currently existing conditions. No further analysis is necessary at this time.

V. Adverse Energy Impact Compliance:

This action has been analyzed as required by Washington Office Instruction Memorandum 2002-053 to determine if it will cause an adverse impact on energy development. The action will not have an adverse direct or indirect impact on energy development, production or distribution. The preparation of a Statement of Adverse Energy Impact is not required.
