

**DECISION RECORD
and
FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

- I. Decision:
It is my decision to authorize the Proposed Action. The action authorizes the installation of two interpretive pullouts on the Bureau of Land Management's Campbell Tract Facility in the City of Anchorage, Alaska (T. 12 N., R. 3 W., Section 2 Seward Meridian).
- II. Rationale for the Decision:
This decision is made in support of public education goals to interpret historic and archaeological resources. It supports the Bureau's Project Archaeology and Heritage Education programs by teaching the values of our historic and archaeological past in order to better protect and preserve this resource. This decision is also consistent with the Southwest Planning Area Management Framework Plan (MFP), Cultural Objective, CR-1 which states that BLM will "protect and preserve cultural sites from damage or destruction."
- III. Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI):
Based on the analysis of potential environmental impacts contained in the attached environmental assessment, I have determined that impacts are not expected to be significant and an environmental impact statement is not required.
- IV. ANILCA Section 810 Compliance:
The proposed action will not significantly restrict Federal subsistence uses, decrease the abundance of federal subsistence resources, alter the distribution of federal subsistence resources, or limit qualified Federal subsistence user access from currently existing conditions. No further analysis is necessary at this time.
- V. Adverse Energy Impact Compliance:
This action has been analyzed as required by Washington Office Instruction Memorandum 2002-053 to determine if it will cause an adverse impact on energy development. The action will not have an adverse direct or indirect impact on energy development, production or distribution. The preparation of a Statement of Adverse Energy Impact is not required.

Stipulations

1. Clearing and soil disturbance shall be minimized where practicable to limit opportunities for invasive, non-native species to become established.
2. Re-vegetation shall be performed using only native species, unpalatable to moose and seed and topsoil shall be certified free of noxious weeds.
3. During and following construction, disturbed areas will be monitored by the BLM for invasive, non-native species of plants, which shall be eradicated by hand, or mechanical means.
4. All work must be conducted between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.
5. Signs will be posted warning the public of construction activity. Barriers will be placed to restrict public access as needed, which will be determined by the project manager.
6. The project manager will remove any trash, markers, and flagging after the project.
7. Any damage to trails, roads, and facilities on CT resulting from the project will be repaired including tire tracks and ruts, gravel displacement, signs, vegetation damage, etc.
8. No off-trail use of motorized equipment is authorized.
