

How should I get there?

-  Park at the BLM Anchorage Field Office
-  Take a convenient shuttle bus from either Kasuun Elementary School or Abbott Loop Community Park. Buses run every 10 to 15 minutes.
-  An additional shuttle bus runs continuously between the Campbell Creek Science Center and the BLM Anchorage Field Office during the event.
-  Walk or ski in from a nearby trailhead.

When should I get there?

The first dog team leaves downtown at 10:00 AM and arrives on the Campbell Tract around 10:45 AM. Dog teams typically come in for the next two to three hours, but we suggest getting here early to avoid disappointment— sometimes the dogs are extra fast!

For the health and safety of the sled dogs as well as your pet, please leave your furry friends at home!


Welcome to the Iditarod Ceremonial Start terminus at the BLM Campbell Tract Facility!
