Subject: BLM-Alaska policy regarding Predator Control by the State of Alaska

Program Area: Predator control.

Purpose: The purpose of this Instruction Memorandum (IM) is to update IM Number AK 2009-09, and to further reaffirm the BLM-Alaska position on state activities related to predator control.

Policy/Action: The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Alaska's policy regarding predator control on the BLM-Alaska administered public lands (these include BLM land that has been tentatively approved for conveyance and those selected for potential future conveyance) is as follows.

Unless predator control activities conflict with on-going or anticipated BLM authorized actions, land use plan decisions for a given area, or create a threat to public safety, the BLM's position on the State's predator control program is: Predator control is a State function.

The BLM Alaska State Office will work with the State's Authorizing Officer and will meet as appropriate to mutually discuss control methods, objectives, timing and to share any potential areas of concern or conflict with the program. Subsequent to the meeting, the State Office will notify potentially affected Field or District Managers as to the location and proposed time periods for predator control work. This will afford the affected managers an opportunity to assess any potential for conflict of use for an affected area(s). If there is a potential conflict, a response will be coordinated at the BLM-Alaska State Office level with the affected manager(s) and the State will be notified.

Coordination: Questions as they relate to BLM-Alaska policy should be answered following the guidance outlined above.
