


SOURDOUGH CREEK CAMPGROUND

OCCUPANCY AND USE

- Camp at a campsite no longer than fourteen (14) days within a 60-day period.
- Campsites are available on a first-come basis and may not be reserved or saved for others.
- Camp within designated areas.
- Operate and park motor vehicles within designated areas.
- Do not leave personal property unattended.
- Build fires only in designated fire rings.
- Cutting live trees or branches is prohibited.
- Moving any table, stove, barrier or other campground equipment is prohibited.
- Use of campground or boat launch facilities for commercial purposes without a permit is prohibited.
- Please respect your neighbors by not operating noisy equipment.
- Discharging or use of firearms, other weapons, or fireworks is prohibited.

SANITATION

- Toilets are for human waste only. No cans, bottles, or other trash.
- Do not dump waste in campground. See bulletin Board for list of area dump stations.
- Keep all pets on a leash or physically restrained, and clean up pet waste.
- Do not clean fish, game, food, clothing, or other items in the vicinity of the potable water faucet.

WATER

Drinking water is provided, subject to availability (see map for location). The water is hauled into this facility, please conserve. Boil, chemically treat, or filter all water from any lake, stream, or pond. Bacteria and parasites in untreated water may make you sick.

BEAR SAFETY

You are in bear country. Please maintain a clean campsite and do not litter. Close garbage can lids securely. Keep food contained. Bears can be very dangerous when they are attracted to human food and garbage.

ACCESSIBILITY

Areas designated on the map as "Most Accessible" provide the best conditions in the campground for persons with disabilities. Ground conditions here make accessibility difficult and even the "Most Accessible" areas may not meet all accessibility standards.

Historical and Informative panels are located throughout the trails of this campground.
