Because this project's revenues are collected at the BLM's statewide administrative office for Arizona, the funds are considered applicable to all Arizona BLM offices. This is because the State Office has no immediate on-the-ground recreational facility or assets to manage. The purpose of this project, therefore, is to provide support to amenity fee sites or special recreation permits on a statewide basis where and when such support cannot be attributed to serving a particular office or amenity site.

None of the revenues generated by this account were utilized during FY 2008 because the account balance was too small to benefit any meaningful support.

PROJECTS/ACTIVITIES PLANNED FOR NEXT YEAR (FY09):

As the project account grows, it becomes more feasible to consider additional amenity fee-related support that may be provided to the various offices and fee sites throughout the state.

Under consideration are:

- Further development and expansion of online permitting services
- Agreements with partners to facilitate further distribution of the Interagency Pass
- Continued maintenance and production of a multi-partnered, multi-agency recreation map that illustrates where campgrounds and other recreational facilities are found throughout the state
