

FY08 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Burro Creek Recreation Site offers 24 campsites for tent or recreational vehicle use (including one universally- accessible site), with picnic tables and campfire grills. Also provided are 2 accessible restroom facilities with water, solar lights and environmental education bulletin boards. The Group Campsite consists of a large shade ramada, accessible tables, pedestal and campfire grills, water and garbage cans. There is a recreational vehicle dump station, a self-service fee station, water and garbage cans located within the recreation site. The day use area offers 5 picnic sites, each with a shade ramada, table and pedestal grill. The Watchable Wildlife Exhibit and Desert Garden provide information to visitors on the native flora and fauna of the area.

Wild Cow Springs Recreation Site offers 17 individual camping/picnicking sites (including one universally- accessible site), a group site, and a short hiking trail. Each site is provided with a picnic table and campfire grill. Three restroom facilities are centrally located in the campground, with nearby environmental education bulletin boards. Garbage cans are centrally located within the recreation site. A self-service fee station is located at the entrance to the recreation site.

Windy Point Recreation Site offers 7 campsites, each containing picnic tables and campfire grills. Trash cans and a restroom facility are centrally-located within the site. A self-service fee station is located at the entrance to the area. Cherum Peak Trail, a 2.5 mile trail, and Packsaddle Recreation Site, a no fee site, are located within two miles of Windy Point Recreation Site.

Visitor Services, Interpretation:

Kingman Field Office (KFO) placed free printed posters, pamphlets and brochures in the bulletin boards. Materials came from various BLM programs, Arizona State Parks, Arizona Game and Fish Department and Tread Lightly!

KFO funded the campground hosts and their uniforms and if appropriate, non-monetary awards.

Repair, Maintenance, and Facility Enhancement:

Kingman Field Office rented equipment to install ramada tables to enhance the remaining sites at Burro Creek Recreation Site.

KFO maintained the recreation sites by purchasing propane for the operation of the water system, cleaning supplies, materials such as lumber, plumbing, painting and concrete and replacement signs and decals.

KFO paid the required testing of the water system.

KFO paid the costs for new and repaired vehicle tires.

Law Enforcement – Public Use and Recreation:

Kingman Field Office partially funded the monthly service fees for the campground host’s satellite phone.

Wildlife Habitat Restoration, Resource Protection:

Kingman Field Office provided labor and leadership of youth volunteers for the maintenance of fences to protect the campground and riparian areas.

Fee Agreements and Reservation Services:

Kingman Field Office takes reservations for the Group Site at Burro Creek Recreation Site from October 1 through April 30 of each high use season. However, in FY’08, no 1232 funds were spent to operate the reservation system.

PROJECTS/ACTIVITIES PLANNED FOR NEXT YEAR (FY09):

Besides the usual operation and maintenance costs, KFO plans to complete the installation of the kiosk pay stations and to partially fund the completion of the new pump house and upgrade of the ADA campsite at Burro Creek Recreation Site. Due to the minimal amount of revenue

generated at the recreation sites, there are times KFO must carry over the revenue from multiple years for projects in order to cover the cost of these projects.
