Greetings Joe,

I am a Trilogy resident and want to state my opposition to the placement of APS power lines in a location other than north of SR 74. The power lines would blight our view of the mountains and desert and to avoid this should be placed on the north side of SR 74. To build high-powered transmission lines through native desert is **not** environmentally reasonable. If they put the lines on the Carefree Highway alignment, they will be visible from Trilogy and many parts of Vistancia. I am completely against this proposal and want to go on record as such. State Route 74 is already designated as a transportation corridor. It makes sense to place power lines along an existing corridor. SR 74 is scheduled by ADOT to be expanded into a 6 lane highway. It will have 1,000 feet on each side of the road scraped for right-of-way. The APS lines would be installed adjacent to that 1,000 foot right-of-way. These are just some of the many reasons **NOT** put these lines along the Carefree Highway but instead place them north of SR 74. Please recognize I did not move to this State and buy a home in a high class retirement community only to have to look at power lines right outside of my neighborhood.
