Subcommittee Background and Purpose

In May 2013 the Kingman Field Office (KFO) provided a preliminary Environmental Assessment (EA) for public review presenting alternatives for fully processing a proposal to renew grazing permits on the Cerbat, Quail Springs and Fort MacEwen grazing allotments administered by the BLM Kingman Field Office (KFO). As a result of public comments on the EA, the BLM decided additional consultation, cooperation and coordination (CCC) was needed.

The BLM Arizona Resource Advisory Council (RAC) formed the grazing subcommittee in November 2013 upon request by the BLM Colorado River District (CRD). In the spirit of the CCC process, the RAC subcommittee is being utilized to evaluate the preliminary EA and provide recommendations.

Timeline

The anticipated timeline for the subcommittee's work is less than one year from the initial meeting in December 2013.

Meetings

All subcommittee meetings are open to the public. Meetings will take place at the Kingman Field Office, 2755 Mission Boulevard, 86401.
