Twin Peaks Gather Inspection

August 21 2010

A total of 30 animals were inspected today consisting of two loads. The first load included 5 studs, one mare and one appaloosa colt, 2 freeze branded geldings. This first load was in good shape with no visible injuries requiring treatment. The second load came from North Observation I believe and consisted of 9 studs, 8 mares and 4 colts.

One grulla colt appears to have an umbilical hernia, will check it out more closely at a later date. One bay may be somewhat ataxic in the hind end, this could be to a cervical spinal issue. Will monitor. There are no visible lameness in this group and are in very good body condition. They are somewhat 'standoffish' but seem to be adjusting.

The up front animals consist of animals previously treated for lameness, swellings and general monitoring. A bay mare has a couple week old sorrel colt which is stiff especially in hind end but improving. Will retreat on Monday. Two buckskin mares have swollen LR fetlock region, treating with antibiotics and banamine. The other treated animals are improving, eating well and unless there are other issues will most likely be turned out with the rest of the animals.

All animals in good body condition.
