

MCINNIS CANYONS NCA

Congress designated the 123,000 acre McInnis Canyons National Conservation Area in 2000 to protect nationally significant resources. Rabbit Valley is an integral part of this special area.

CAMP ONLY IN DESIGNATED SITES

Camp only at the Rabbit Valley (5 sites), Castle Rocks (1 site) or Knowles Canyon Overlook (4 sites) primitive campsites or one of the designated undeveloped sites. Designated undeveloped sites are signed with a brown post showing a numbered tent symbol. Camping at these sites require the use of a porta-a-potty and a fire pan.

Camping in Rabbit Valley is limited to 7 days.

USE DESIGNATED TRAILS/STAGING AREAS

Help take care of this area by staying on designated trails. *Please offload OHV'S in established areas only.*

LEAVE NO TRACE

Please minimize your impact to this special area by learning and practicing Principles of Leave No Trace:

1. Travel and camp on durable surfaces.
2. Dispose of waste properly.
3. Leave what you find.
4. Minimize campfire impacts.
5. Respect wildlife.
6. Be considerate of others
