



Directions	I-70 Exit 157 at Wolcott and turn north. Turn left onto frontage road (Old Highway 6) at stop sign. Follow road 2 miles past bridge and Wolcott Yacht Club. Turn off to right at Wolcott Recreation Area and follow road downhill.	I-70 Exit 140 at Gypsum and turn south. Turn right on the frontage road (Old Highway 6) and go 1.5 miles past the roundabout. Take a left to the Gypsum Recreation Area.	I-70 Exit 133 at Dotsero and turn north onto CR 301 (Colorado River Road). Proceed approximately 2.5 miles. Turn at the National Forest Access sign onto Deep Creek Road. Go through private property for the first 2 miles until enter BLM. Campsites are marked along the road, as well as walk-in sites at the Coffeepot trailhead. White River National Forest access is further up the road. Be careful of trucks on road.	I-70 Exit 133 at Dotsero and turn north onto County Road 301 (Colorado River Road). Follow road over several one lane bridge crossings for 27 miles until you reach another bridge crossing. Park on left side to access boat ramp and campground.	I-70 Exit 133 at Dotsero and turn north onto County Road 301 (Colorado River Road). Regulations For Developed Areas:

1. Quiet hours are 10 pm - 6 am. Please respect other visitors.
2. Where there is no garbage collection, you must pack out what you bring in. Waste water holding tanks may not be drained on the ground.
3. Accessible sites are reserved for people with disabilities until 6 pm daily in developed campsites.
4. Pets must be on a secure leash no longer than 6 feet or under control of a person.
5. Horses and other pack animals are not permitted in developed campgrounds.
6. Do not discharge or use firearms, other weapons or fireworks in developed campgrounds.
7. Do not deface, remove or destroy plants, soil, rocks or minerals, signs, markers, structures or other property.
8. Drive and park only on roads and places provided for that purpose in developed campgrounds.

Stay Limit For Developed & Undeveloped Camping:

Observe Camping Stay Limit: From April 1 to August 31, it is 7 days, and from September 1 to March 31, it is 14 days. Campers must relocate at least 30 miles and may not return within 30 days to a previous campsite. Camping is for recreational purposes only. Personal property may not be left unattended on public land for longer than 24 hours!

Undeveloped/Dispersed - no facilities

It is the general policy of the BLM that undeveloped federal lands under its administration are available to the public for camping and general recreation, with the following provisions:

1. Pack out what you pack in.
2. Avoid camping within 150 feet of any water source.
3. Please use portable toilets in undeveloped sites for the protection of visitors and water quality.
4. Prior to building a campfire, check with local authorities for restrictions!
5. Do not leave campfires unattended.
6. Dispose of waste properly.
7. Travel and camp on durable surfaces (established trails and camps, rock, gravel, or drainages).
8. Disperse rock fire rings after use and pack out ash.

Developed:


Developed campgrounds have a variety of facilities such as fire rings, picnic tables, toilets, and (garbage cans Wolcott and Gypsum only).

Fires in Developed Areas:

Fires are permitted only in the metal fire rings and grills in developed campsites. Extinguish your campfire before leaving it unattended. **DO NOT BRING FIREWOOD FROM OUT OF STATE.** If you'll be camping during your trip, please help protect our public lands by buying local firewood near your destination campground. Firewood can spread harmful insect pests and diseases such as Emerald Ash Borer, Sirex Wood Wasp, Gypsy Moth, Asian Longhorned Beetle, and Oak Wilt Disease.
