



FACT SHEET: Grand Junction RMP, Land Tenure Adjustments

Under each alternative, specific tracts are identified as available for general disposal and cooperative management agreement. Disposal tracts are suitable for disposal through a variety of authorities, as deemed appropriate, such as sale, exchange, or Recreation and Public Purposes Act leases and conveyances. Cooperative management tracts are suitable for qualified agencies or entities to manage or acquire through exchange, administrative transfer, or other appropriate means.

Map Figures 2-30 through 2-33 in Appendix A identify the lands available for disposal and cooperative management by alternative. Key land tenure decision descriptions, including disposal and acquisition criteria, are found on pages 2-162 through 2-169 in Volume 1.
