




Dice Hill

Limited Use Area

Responsible Camping

- * Use existing campsites. Parking for camping is limited to 50' from centerline of the road or trail.
- * Camping is limited to 14 days.
- * Observe all fire restrictions.
- * Use fire wisely - use existing fire rings. Firepans or stoves are recommended on BLM.
- * Use only dead and down wood or wood that you packed in for campfires. Burn logs to ashes, then add water and mix and make sure it's out before you leave.
- * Do not put cans, bottles, or aluminum foil in your fire.
- * Pack out your trash (and a little extra).
- * Dispose of human waste properly.



Responsible Hunting

- * Parking for hunting or game retrieval is limited to 50' from centerline of the road or trail. No motorized travel beyond this is allowed for game retrieval.
- * Follow State Game Laws - It is illegal to shoot from or use a motor vehicle to hunt, chase, harass, or drive wildlife.
- * Remember to unload Firearms - Firearms are required by law to be completely unloaded while being carried in or on an OHV.
- * Minimize motor vehicle use when on a hunt. Motors startle game, forcing them to flee to more secluded areas, predominantly private land. Where you go and how you get there could mean the difference between a successful hunt and an unsuccessful hunt!

Protect Your Public Lands Cultural Heritage

Enjoy but do not destroy Historic, Archaeological or Fossil Resources.

Collecting, Digging or Damaging Artifacts or Vertebrate Fossils on Federal Land are serious federal offenses subject to criminal penalties.



Livestock Use and Gate Closure's

The Dice Hill Area an integral part of local ranching operations. As you enjoy the area, please cooperate with the local ranchers and close the gates when indicated on the sign beside the gate.

Rotation grazing systems are used in the Dice Hill Area. These systems have proven beneficial to the resource and will maintain or improve the condition of the range. It allows the native vegetation to continue to dominate the region. Proper livestock grazing management is also a strong deterrent to the establishment and expansion of weedy species.



The route designations apply to routes and portions that are on Public Lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management.

The use of private lands is by permission only. Ask for permission before using routes on private lands.

Welcome to Dice Hill

The Dice Hill area offers a variety of recreational opportunities including hiking, wildlife viewing, picnicking, sightseeing, fishing, hunting, horseback riding, and camping.

The area's existing network of primitive roads and trails meet a variety of needs of local residents and public land users. These routes were designated as part of the 1988 Off Highway Vehicle Implementation Plan. The purpose of this limited use designation is to protect vegetation which provides food and cover for wildlife and livestock while protecting the watershed. This also provides areas for quality hunting opportunities and reduces trespass onto private lands.

Roads and trails that are open to motorized vehicles are posted as such. Any route that does not have a sign indicating that it is Open for motorized use, is Closed. Snowmobiles use on snow is permitted throughout the Dice Hill Area.

OHV Use on BLM Public Lands

Follow the signing and use trails only designated as Open.

Using trails or area's closed to motorized vehicles is prohibited.

It is prohibited to operate a motorized vehicle in violation of state laws and regulations relating to use, standards, registration, operation, and inspection of off-road vehicles.

No person shall operate a motorized vehicle on public lands:

- 1) In a manner causing, or likely to cause significant, undue damage to or disturbance of the soil, wildlife, wildlife habitat, improvements, cultural or vegetative resources or other authorized uses of public lands.
- 2) During night hours, from a half-hour after sunset to a half-hour before sunrise, without lighted headlights and taillights.
- 3) Off-Highway Vehicle and snowmobile operators must have a valid registration. Call Colorado State Parks at 303-866-3437 for more information.
- 4) All OHV's must have a spark-arresting device when operating on public lands.
- 5) The decibel limit for the State of Colorado is 99dba. Have your vehicle checked! Persons operating a vehicle louder than 99dba may be ticketed.
